SUBJECT: Staff Report, 19-04-CD, *Todd Smith v. John Quick*

PROCEDURAL POSTURE

On September 18, 2019, Todd Smith filed an Expedited Complaint against John Quick, a candidate running for election to the Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough.¹ Mr. Smith alleged that Quick and an organization named Alaska Yes, were unlawfully coordinating on advertisements supporting the Quick campaign.²

On September 19, 2019, the Commission held a hearing on the Expedited Complaint; and on the same day issued an Emergency Cease and Desist Order requiring Quick to cease and desist from coordinating with Alaska Yes on advertisements supporting his campaign.³ In its Order, the Commission also referred the Complaint to staff for further investigation concerning whether Quick violated contribution-reporting requirements by failing to report the advertisements as campaign contributions.

ISSUES

Did the Alaska Yes and Quick campaigns consult and coordinate such that Alaska Yes's expenditures supporting Quick and opposing his opponent were not "independent expenditures" as that term is defined in AS 15.13.400(10); and if so, did the Quick campaign violate contribution-reporting requirements by failing to report Alaska Yes's advertisements as campaign contributions.

SHORT ANSWERS

Alaska Yes’s expenditures supporting the Quick Campaign and opposing his opponent were not independent because the Quick campaign’s chairman was consulted concerning the expenditures; and because Peter Zuyus, through the consulting business, Juggernaut Consulting Services, LLC, assisted both the Quick campaign and Alaska Yes with their political communications.

Because Alaska Yes’s expenditures supporting the Quick campaign and opposing his opponent were not independent, they are considered contributions to the Quick campaign.

Because Alaska Yes used funds from businesses and individuals who contributed more than \$500 to support its expenditures in favor of the Quick campaign, its contributions to the Quick campaign are prohibited and must be returned by Quick.⁴

Quick did not violate contribution-reporting requirements because he was an exempt municipal candidate and did not go over the \$5,000 threshold of contributions received or expenditures made.⁵

FACTS

A. Juggernaut and Peter Zuyus

Juggernaut Consulting, LLC (“Juggernaut”), is an Alaska corporation founded on June 30, 2018, by Peter Zuyus, its sole member.⁶ During the 2019 Kenai Peninsula Borough Municipal Election, Juggernaut provided election-related services to both Quick and Alaska Yes.⁷ Juggernaut invoiced for Quick’s campaign signs; the costs of raising money for Alaska Yes’s campaign coffers; Facebook and radio media for Quick’s campaign; radio and news media for Alaska Yes; and digital ads for Alaska Yes.⁸

B. Quick Campaign

Quick began his campaign for the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly on July 10, 2019, by filing a Letter of Intent.⁹ On August 2, 2019, Quick filed a Candidate Registration naming Paul Huber as the Chairman of his campaign.¹⁰ Paul Huber remained Quick’s campaign Chairman through September 19, 2019.¹¹

On August 4, 2019, Peter Zuyus sent an email to Quick and Huber with a suggestion of campaign points that would be good for signs and internet advertisements.¹²

On August 16, 2019, Huber sent an email to Quick and Zuyus with recommendations for changes to Quick’s campaign website.¹³

On August 19, 2019, Huber and Zuyus exchanged emails concerning different versions of Quick’s campaign signs.¹⁴

On August 23, 2019, Huber emailed Zuyus with the campaign sign approved by Quick.¹⁵

On September 2, 2019, Huber emailed Zuyus and Quick with an approval for a radio campaign advertisement.¹⁶ In the email, Huber also makes suggestions for topics that Alaska Yes might use in its communications supporting Quick.¹⁷

On September 11, 2019, Quick responded to Zuyus’ email to Quick and Huber proposing an edit to a radio advertisement for the Quick campaign.¹⁸ Also on September 11, 2019, Huber and Zuyus coordinated on a “redo” of the proposed Quick radio advertisement.¹⁹

C. Alaska Yes Campaign

On September 1, 2019, Zuyus emailed Alaska Yes Treasurer, Kathy Toms, and directed her to contact APOC because Alaska Yes “had just gone active” and would be supporting positions in municipal races.²⁰

On September 8, 2019, Zuyus emailed to Huber and others an “IMPORTANT MESSAGE” reminding them that, “an important mission of Alaska Yes is to support candidates from the local level up to state candidates”; that there were 4 political issues to support (No to Proposition 1, candidates Quick, Henry, and Odd); and that Juggernaut should be allocated up to \$4,000 for those campaigns.²¹

Between September 5, 2019 and September 20, 2019, Alaska Yes ran several Facebook advertisement campaigns supporting Quick and opposing his opponent, Jesse Bjorkman.²² The advertisements include two video endorsements of Quick that ran between September 5 and 7, 2019.²³

At the September 19 expedited hearing on this matter, Kathy Toms, Alaska Yes’s Treasurer, testified that Huber, Quick’s campaign Chairman, was included on Alaska Yes emails concerning campaign plans and projects.²⁴ An example of this is found on September 16, 2019, when Zuyus emailed a proposed advertisement concerning Quick’s opponent, Jesse Bjorkman to the Board of Alaska Yes and to Paul Huber.²⁵

The funds and resources used by Alaska Yes to support Quick and oppose his opponent included funds and resources received from businesses and corporations; and from individuals who provided in excess of \$500 during calendar year 2019.²⁶

LAW AND ANALYSIS

A. Alaska Yes’s Expenditures Supporting Quick And Opposing His Opponent Were Not Independent

An independent expenditure is defined at AS 15.13.400(10):

“independent expenditure” means an expenditure that is made without the direct or indirect consultation or cooperation with, or at the suggestion or request of, or with the prior consent of, a candidate, a candidate’s campaign treasurer or deputy campaign treasurer, or another person acting as a principal or agent of the candidate.

Furthermore, an independent expenditure *does not include* an expenditure made in cooperation or consultation with a person acting as an agent of the candidate, group or non-group entity; and is not independent if it is:

“Based on information that the candidate or an agent of the candidate, group, or non-group entity provides about plans, projects, or needs of the candidate, group or non-group entity.”²⁷

In this case, the evidence shows that Zuyus, an agent of both Quick and Alaska Yes was intimately involved in both the creative and day-to-day aspects of both the Quick and the Alaska Yes campaigns supporting Quick. Examples of this include the emails and invoice discussed above concerning campaign signs, their design and purchase. The investigation revealed the same pattern with respect to a radio ad produced for the Quick campaign also discussed above.

Furthermore, the investigation revealed that Quick’s campaign manager, Huber, was privy to Alaska Yes’s projects and was included on Alaska Yes’s emails detailing project plans; and, even suggested to Zuyus that certain campaign positions could be used by Alaska Yes if not used by Quick.²⁸ In fact, Alaska Yes did use one of the suggestions in attacking Quick’s opponent for being a “union champion.”²⁹

A preponderance of the evidence supports a finding that Alaska Yes’s expenditures supporting Quick and opposing his opponent were not independent expenditures because they were coordinated either directly with the candidate or his Chairman.

B. Alaska Yes’s Expenditures Supporting Quick And Opposing His Opponent Were Contributions To The Quick Campaign

The term, “contribution” includes a purchase, payment, promise, or obligation to pay, loan or loan guarantee, deposit or gift of money, goods or services for which charge is ordinarily made...that is rendered to the candidate...and that is made for the purpose of influencing the nomination or election of a candidate.³⁰

Furthermore, the term, “contribution” includes, “anything of value made for or provided to a candidate by a person, group or nongroup entity” for the purpose of influencing the nomination or election of a candidate.³¹

The term, “anything of value” includes “any item, property, or services, tangible or intangible, that could reasonably be considered to be a material advantage, or of material worth, use, or service to a person receiving the item, property or services.”³²

In this case, Alaska Yes paid Juggernaut \$3,008.18 for radio, print and Facebook expenses in connection with the four Kenai Peninsula Borough campaigns it had decided to get involved with: proposition 1, Quick, Odd, and Henry.³³ Alaska Yes paid Juggernaut an additional \$133 for advertisements supporting Quick in two local publications.³⁴

These advertising expenditures supporting the Quick campaign were clearly something of value to the Quick campaign, and because they were not independent, they were in-kind contributions to the Quick campaign.

C. Alaska Yes's In-Kind Contributions To The Quick Campaign Were Prohibited

A business may not contribute to a candidate.³⁵ An individual may not contribute more than \$500 per year to a candidate.³⁶ Alaska Yes's expenditures in favor of Quick were supported in part by contributions from businesses and from individuals who contributed more than \$500 to Alaska Yes in 2019. Such funds are prohibited to a candidate. Accordingly, Alaska Yes's in-kind contributions to Quick, supported by such funds, were, themselves prohibited.

A candidate is required to return prohibited contributions to the contributor immediately upon discovery;³⁷ but in no case, later than 10 days after discovery.³⁸ In this case, there is a preponderance of evidence that Quick became aware of the consultation and cooperation between his campaign and the Alaska Yes campaign no later than September 2, 2019, when Huber, his campaign Chair, made campaign suggestions for Alaska Yes in an email to Quick and Zuyus:

Several other suggestions perhaps for ak yes

- *A public servant you can believe in.*
- *Nikiski, do you want a union champion representing you? No!!!
John represents the people, not a union. Vote for John Quick, a genuine conservative.*³⁹

Accordingly, Quick violated AS 15.13.114 by failing to return the value of the in-kind contributions received from Alaska Yes.

Quick Did Not Violate Contribution-Reporting Requirements.

A municipal candidate who does not intend to accept more than \$5,000 in contributions or expend more than \$5,000 in seeking election, may file an exemption form which frees the candidate from making regular campaign disclosure reports.⁴⁰

In this case, Quick filed an exemption form on August 2, 2019.⁴¹ Furthermore, Quick's bank records indicate that he has received \$2,640 in contributions and has expended \$2,134.50 – both under the \$5,000 threshold, even when an additional \$885.05 is added for the value of Alaska Yes's in-kind contributions.⁴²

Accordingly, there is insufficient evidence to conclude that Quick violated any contribution-reporting requirement.

CONCLUSION

Quick violated AS 15.13.114 by failing to timely return the value of prohibited in-kind contributions from Alaska Yes. Quick did not violate AS 15.13.040(a) by failing to report the prohibited contributions because Quick was exempt from filing those reports.

MAXIMUM CIVIL PENALTY

The maximum civil penalty for failing to timely return a prohibited contribution is \$50 per day for each day the violation continues.⁴³ In this case, the violation continued for six days after the regulatory grace period of 10 days. Accordingly, the maximum civil penalty in this case is \$300.

MITIGATION AND RECOMMENDATION

A civil penalty may be reduced by up to 50% if the person is an inexperienced filer. An inexperienced filer includes a candidate engaged in his first election cycle.⁴⁴ Here, Quick was engaged in his first election cycle. Nevertheless, staff does not recommend any

reduction in the maximum civil penalty of \$300 because Quick was well aware of Zuyus' connection to Alaska Yes and took no action to resolve the potential problem even after September 2, 2019, when he knew for certain that his campaign Chair was making campaign suggestions to Alaska Yes.

Staff further recommends that Quick be ordered to pay the sum of \$885.05 to Alaska Yes as reimbursement for the prohibited contributions he received from Alaska Yes.

Staff spent approximately 12 hours investigating this complaint. Thus, the costs of investigation are \$510. Based on Quick's complete and full cooperation in the investigation staff does not recommend that the costs of investigation be imposed.

FIRST: The name of the corporation (the "Corporation") is: Alaska Yes, Inc.

SECOND: The address of the registered office of the Corporation in the State of Alaska is Gilman & Pevehouse, 130 South Willow Street #3, Kenai, Alaska 99611. The name of the Corporation's registered agent at such address is Blaine D. Gilman.

THIRD: The Corporation is organized as a nonprofit corporation and shall not have any capital stock. The Corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively to promote social welfare as defined in Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and the Regulations thereunder, as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended (collectively referred to as "Code"). The Corporation shall have and may exercise, to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the purposes of the Corporation, any and all powers conferred upon nonprofit corporations organized pursuant to the provisions of the Alaska Nonprofit Corporation Act (the "Act") and other applicable laws, subject to the limitations set forth in the Fifth Paragraph of these Articles.

FOURTH: The Corporation shall not have members.

FIFTH: The powers of the Corporation shall be subject to the following terms, provisions and limitations:

1. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of any director or officer of the Corporation, or any private person, except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services actually rendered to or for the Corporation, and no director or officer of the Corporation, or any private person, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets on dissolution of the Corporation.
2. In the event of the liquidation, dissolution, or winding up of the Corporation in any manner or for any reason whatever, all of the assets of the Corporation after the payment of the obligations and liabilities of the Corporation shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Code Sections 501(c)(4) or 501(c)(3), or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.

SIXTH: A director of the Corporation shall not be personally liable to the Corporation or its members for monetary damages for breach of fiduciary duty as a director, except to the extent such exemption from liability or limitation thereof is not permitted under the Act, as the same exists or may hereafter be amended. Any repeal or modification of the foregoing sentence shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a director of the Corporation existing hereunder with respect to any act or omission occurring prior to such repeal or modification.





HEARING PROCEDURES

- 1) **Parties.** The parties in this case are Complainant and Respondent.
- 2) **Issues.** At the hearing, the Commission will consider whether the Respondent violated AS 15.13 as alleged by Complainant in his expedited complaint.
- 3) **Hearing procedures.** The hearing will be conducted as provided in AS 15.13.380, 2 AAC 50.891, and the Alaska Administrative Procedure Act, AS 44.62.330 – 44.62.630. All testimony must be presented or submitted under oath. A party may call witnesses, cross-examine witnesses, present and rebut evidence. If the Respondent does not testify, the Respondent may be called and examined as if under cross-examination.

EMERGENCY CEASE-AND-DESIST ORDER

Todd Smith complains that John Quick, who is running for the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly, is authorizing or approving advertisements paid for by Alaska Yes, Inc., in violation of AS 15.13.135. After hearing the matter on an expedited basis, the Commission concludes that Mr. Quick’s campaign is aiding and abetting a probable violation by Alaska Yes of the disclaimer requirement.¹ The Alaska Public Offices Commission (APOC) orders Mr. Quick and his campaign to immediately cease and desist from coordinating with Alaska Yes on advertisements that state they are “not authorized, paid for or approved by any candidate” and remands the complaint to staff for further investigation.²

Mr. Smith filed his complaint against Mr. Quick on September 18, 2019, and requested expedited consideration. Since early voting is underway and the election is set

for October 1, the Commission granted Mr. Smith's request on the record, concluding that the "alleged violation, if not immediately restrained, could materially affect the outcome of an election" and "could cause irreparable harm that penalties could not adequately remedy."³ The Commission heard the matter a day later, on September 19. Mr. Smith, Mr. Quick, and Kathy Toms, who is the treasurer for Alaska Yes, testified. Attorney Stacey Stone represented Mr. Quick.

Alaska Yes's original incorporation documents and an APOC report filed in September list Mr. Quick as a director of the entity. Mr. Quick testified that although he helped incorporate Alaska Yes, he resigned as a director and ended his involvement with the group in March. He filed his candidacy to be a Kenai Peninsula Borough assembly member in August. He testified that he had not coordinated with Alaska Yes on the advertisements and did not approve of them.

The group treasurer, Ms. Toms, testified that she had been the group treasurer for only three weeks and erroneously filed the APOC report indicating that Mr. Quick was a director because no one told her he was no longer involved. She amended the report later in September when she learned that he had resigned in March. In terms of the group's advertisements, she explained that Alaska Yes President Peter Zuyus created the advertisements and circulated them via email for review and approval to a number of people. She stated that she, Alaska Yes directors and vice presidents Nona Safra and Wayne Ogle, and Quick's campaign manager Paul Huber responded to the emails. The

advertisements state that they are paid for by Alaska Yes, approved by Ms. Toms, and “not authorized, paid for or approved by any candidate.”

After her testimony, Mr. Quick acknowledged that Mr. Huber was his campaign manager but stated that he had not acted with Mr. Quick’s consent in reviewing the Alaska Yes advertisements before they were distributed or aired.

Alaska Statute 15.13.135(b) requires that a person who makes independent expenditures for communications that support or oppose a candidate provide a disclaimer that the communication is “not authorized, paid for, or approved by the candidate.” The Commission concludes that Ms. Toms’ testimony that Mr. Quick’s campaign manager reviewed Alaska Yes’s ads before distribution establishes that the ads’ disclaimer that they “were not authorized, paid for, or approved by any candidate” is false. The ads are a probable violation by Alaska Yes of the disclaimer requirements in AS 15.13.135. (The Commission does not decide whether Alaska Yes violated AS 15.13.135 because no complaint against that group has been filed.)

Under AS 15.13.380(d), the Commission orders Mr. Quick and his campaign to immediately cease and desist from coordinating with Alaska Yes on advertisements that state they are “not authorized, paid for or approved by any candidate.” The Commission refers the complaint for further investigation by staff on a regular basis. The Commission directs staff to investigate whether Mr. Quick violated contribution-reporting requirements

by failing to report the authorized or approved advertisements as campaign contributions and to provide a recommendation on a civil penalty assessment, if any.⁴

TOMS: Oh, I forwarded that message to Peter Zuyus an' then he started contacting me an' telling me that... that everybody was really upset because John was listed and he's not supposed to be listed an'... an' I just said how am I supposed to know an' uh... So, then I went on an' I took him off.

And in fact, I didn't respond to it an' he, he sent it- another one to me this morning showing the original um entity classification that is incorrect showing John and he asked if I had any comments and I went back into it about an hour later and its all gone. It's deleted. But, I do have screenshots of the original one an' I did send them to Stacey, so she's got them.

COMMISSIONER HANCOCK: Oh, oh, oh! Oh ma'am, this is Commissioner Hancock. Did you know who this Mr. Smith is or his affiliations or was this, this something random?

MS. TOMS: I have no idea who he is. He's not a friend or anything, it just appeared in my Messenger.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Do the commissioners have any other questions for Ms. Toms?

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: Yeah this is –

COMMISSIONER STILLIE: (inaudible)

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: Yeah, go ahead.

COMMISSIONER STILLIE: Okay. (inaudible) this is uh, this is Commissioner Stillie. Um, do you know Mr. Quick?

MS. TOMS: No, I don't.

COMMISSIONER STILLIE: So, you've never, you've never had any discussions or anything to do with Mr. Quick?

MS. TOMS: That's correct.

COMMISSIONER STILLIE: Okay.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Uh...

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: (at the same time) Uh, this is Commissioner Lawrence. You say you had a screenshot of the original Facebook page and you gave it to Stacey. Who, who's Stacey?

MS. TOMS: Uh, the attorney. I also forwarded it to Peter. I initially forwarded it to Peter and said, you know, this is what's happening.

being, well uh – COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: All right. Uh, uh the attorney

MS. TOMS: (interrupting) Stacey Stone. I forwarded it to her this morning.

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: Alright, uh, uh Ms. Stone, do you have uh, do you have that screen shot with you.

MS. STONE: Uh, it's on my cell phone. I can read it into the record. It's um not wholly relevant to the issue at hand but I am happy to read it um into the record if... an' Ms. Toms can confirm that that's the content.

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: Okay, would you, would you please then?

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Okay, well um. Ms. Stone, if you want to read uh the, the email into the record and then Ms. uh Toms can confirm that that was the email that she actually received.

MS. STONE: Uh, there is a message from a person named Frank, there is no name associated with the screen shot. It says that, as the treasurer of Alaska Yes, I hope you are prepared to for a lawsuit for the libelous and slanderous post they put on Facebook. Conservatives should put up a less flawed candidate (in parens, Mr. Quick) rather than attacking a good person like Mr. Bjorkman. I am a vote red conservative, but no more locally from what I'm seeing locally. An' then, um, at some time later, he sent another message that said, any comments.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Uh, Ms. Toms, is that the email that you received on... uh what was the date of the email...(inaudible).

MS. TOMS: Yes, that's, that's correct.

MS. STONE: (interrupting) there's, there's no date associated with the email.

MS. TOMS: (at the same time) Um there's no date yeah.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Uh, Ms. Toms, what is your relationship with uh Peter Zuyus?

MS. TOMS: I don't have a relationship with him, he's the president of the uh Alaska Yes.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: And you are the treasurer of Alaska Yes.

MS. TOMS: Yes

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: But you don't have a relationship with the president of Alaska Yes?

MS. TOMS: I don't understand what you're asking.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: I'm asking you what your relationship is with Mr. Peter Zuyus, who is the president of Alaska Yes.

MS. TOMS: I just know him from political fundraisers n' stuff that we've been to.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: So, you don't have meetings with Mr. Peter Zuyus...

MS. TOMS: We haven't had a meeting yet... with Alaska Yes.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Have you ever met Mr. Zuyus in person regarding Alaska–

MS. TOMS: (interrupting) Yes!

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: (at the same time) Yes?

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Regarding Alaska Yes?

MS. TOMS: (interrupting) Um... yes! Well, informally at a fundraiser that we had.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Okay an' what is your relationship with Nona Safra?

MS. TOMS: Um, she's a local um Anchor Pointer and she does a lot of fund raising and a lot of political events. She's the District 31 chair an' I am the uh precinct leader. Hence, we do a lot of uh events together for the District 31 political party.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: And have you ever met with Nona Safra regarding Alaska Yes.

MS. TOMS: No.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: And how do you know Wayne Ogle?

MS. TOMS: I don't know him. Um, I've met him a couple of times; I know he was an assembly man.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Do you know that he's the vice president of Alaska Yes?

MS. TOMS: Yes.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: But you've never met with him regarding Alaska Yes.

MS. TOMS: That's correct.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Have you...

MS. TOMS: (interrupting) We haven't had any formal meetings.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Ever?

MS. TOMS: Um I've only been with them for three weeks.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: And how did you join them?

MS. TOMS: Um by telephone. Nona asked me to be the treasurer and I then talked to Peter an' I agreed to it.

MS. TOMS: I've done these filings and I'm setting up the QuickBooks account and I'll start doing the accounting and, and, more filings, whatever's required.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: So, do you have any knowledge of any of the ads that are being run or any involvement in that.

MS. TOMS: Yes, they've been, Peter has been putting them out on emails and we've been listening to them an' saying that we approve of them n' making changes to some of them suggesting changes.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: But you haven't had any meetings with these people.

MS. TOMS: That's correct, it's all been email an' phones; not face to face, so (unintelligible) yeah.

COMMISSIONER HANCOCK: But, so, so, excuse me for kind of following this train of thought. You haven't had any formal meetings, but you have been in contact with folks as far as uh, you know, planning or approving of ads or, ya know, um things of that nature. Has this been on a regular basis or just kind of when something happens it happens, and you know, they send you an email or give you a phone call?

MS. TOMS: That- that's, you've got it. That's exactly how it's been going.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: So, you... but you never spoke with John Quick during this time.

MS. TOMS: No, I never have.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: So, you didn't have any question why he should be on the filing on September 5th?

MS. TOMS: That's correct. Why would I? I, I didn't know that he was not - that he'd resigned.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Okay.

MS. TOMS: I didn't know if he was not included in these emails.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Okay. Do the commissioners have any other questions for Ms. Toms?

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Uh, one last question, so it was never communicated to you when you accepted the position as treasure, treasurer that John Quick was a director of Alaska Yes? Or...

MS. TOMS: (interrupting) that's correct.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Or that he had resigned.

MS. TOMS: that's correct.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Were you aware...

MS. TOMS: (interrupting) I went to the Alaska website and just took it off what was there.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Okay. Thanks, um. Any other questions for any of the commissioners? Okay. Um... Hearing none, uh I, I will give um, if that concludes your - do you have any other...

MS. STONE: I just- just- No, I just have one rebuttal question for Ms. Toms. Uh, Ms. Toms is it your testimony today that your original entity filing with regard to Alaska USA, er well, Alaska Yes was errant and required amendment?

MS. TOMS: That's correct.

MS. STONE: Nothing further.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Um, Mr. Smith... Are you there?

MR. SMITH: Yes, I am.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Okay. Um... So, you can you can- y-y-you might have an opportunity now to uh reply to some of the testimony that you just heard. Okay?

MR. SMITH: Okay.

MR. SMITH: Alright.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: (at the same time) Um.

MR. SMITH: Um...

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: (at the same time) So...

MR. SMITH: Well...

So, I took that to mean that on September 18, when I received the email back from him, Blaine Gilman was his lawyer and Blaine Gilman was also a fellow incorporator with Alaska Yes. The other question I have would be the nature of the resignation. Was it a signed resignation or just an informal email? Um, and I guess the third and final point I would like to make is to my knowledge Paul Huber is um John Quick's campaign manager.

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Oh dear. Okay uh... we have, uh we have just received some information I don't know if all the members of the commission on the phone have um the information. It does appear that as of August 6, 2019, Paul Huber is the chair um for- of Mr. Quick's (unintelligible). Yeah. Did everybody get this?

MS. HEBDON: I emailed- it's in the respondent's position and I did email that to all the commissioners.

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: Madam chair, this is Commissioner Lawrence. Ya know, I'm in Fairbanks, so could someone read this to me?

CHAIRWOMAN HELZER: Um yes. Do you not have the um... Did you not get the uh position of the respondent? It should have been sent out today.

COMMISSIONER LAWRENCE: I did, yeah. Was that what you're referring to?

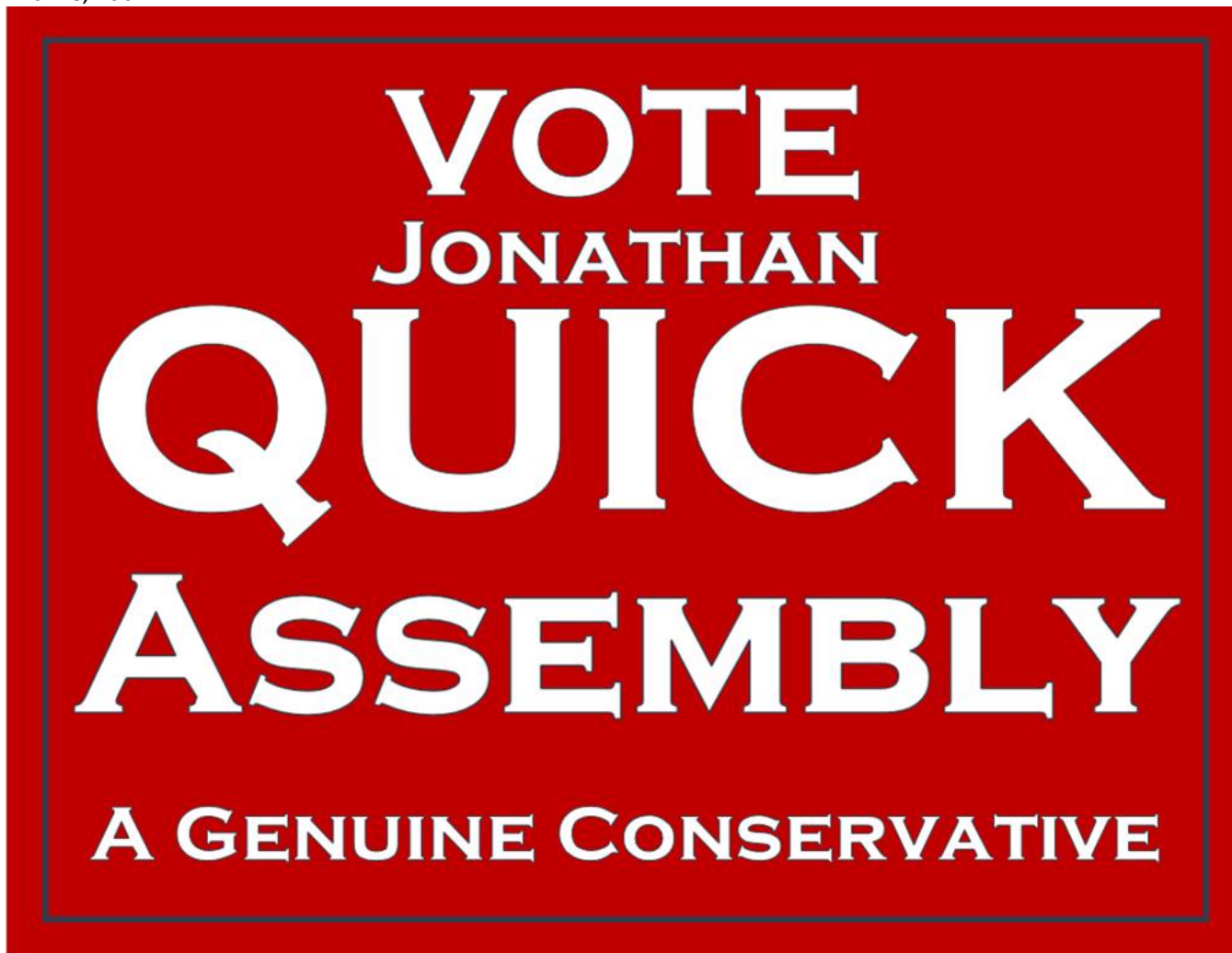



Staff believes that [2 AAC 50.801\(c\)](#) affords the protection you desire:

2 AAC 50.801. Reports; public records

(a) A report, record, or other information in the commission's possession may be inspected at the commission's office during regular business hours unless the commission has determined that the report, record, or other information is confidential. The commission will provide a copy of any report, record, or other information in the commission's possession, at cost as provided in [AS 40.25.110](#) - 40.25.120.

(b) A person may request a determination that information in the commission's possession, including discovery the staff obtains in an investigation, is protected by a state or federal statute, privilege, or constitutional right, and must be kept confidential. If the commission determines, on request or on its own motion, that information in the commission's possession is protected by a state or federal statute, privilege, or constitutional right, the commission will keep the information confidential.

(c) While a staff investigation under [2 AAC 50.875](#) is in progress, the commission's files relating to that investigation are confidential. After the investigation is concluded and the final commission order is issued, any person may view or copy an investigation file, except for documents the commission has determined to keep confidential under (b) of this section.
