This is a supplemental notice by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska adding to the March 22, 1999, notice issued by the APUC in this proceeding. This supplemental notice is being issued because the Commission has determined that the proposed regulations dealing with criteria for public interest pay telephone service needed to be modified as a result of public comment. Regarding the proposed rules for public interest pay telephone service described above as 3 AAC 53.740 - 3 AAC 53.799, the Commission proposes to add a new section, 3 AAC 53.780, to those provisions. The proposed regulations dealing with public interest pay telephone service are set out above and also include the following:

3 AAC 52.240. This section would be repealed to delete the requirement for public interest pay telephones.

3 AAC 53.350. This section would be amended to align state regulations regarding universal service fund with federal regulations.

3 AAC 53.780. This section sets out miscellaneous provisions regarding public interest pay telephones.

This supplemental notice provides that any person interested may present written comments relevant to the proposed action by writing to the Regulatory Commission of Alaska, 1016 West Sixth Avenue, Suite 400, Anchorage, Alaska 99501. Written comments must be filed by January 31, 2000.

Because of the extensive comments already received on the previous version of these regulations and the incorporation of the suggestions made by the public, the Commission will provide for an opportunity to file written comment, but no further public hearing is scheduled.
