SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Notice is given that the State Board of Education, under the authority of AS 14.07.020, AS 14.07.060, and AS 14.20.020, proposes to amend regulations in 4 AAC 12.030, dealing with Type B Certificates.

This is a supplemental notice adding to the notice of proposed changes issued December 23, 1999. The supplemental notice is issued to provide an additional period of written comment and an additional oral hearing on the amended proposal. The amended proposal would:

• amend sections to allow school psychologists a route to obtain an administrator certificate with an endorsement as director of special education.

· limit holders of such certificates to performing the functions of a director of special education unless the holder meets the other requirements for a Type B certificate.
