Nominations are now open for one elected position on the Public Employees? Retirement Board. Mary A. Notar, who will be retiring from the board in November 1999, currently holds this position. The person elected to this position will serve for six years. The board usually meets monthly, from one to three days each month. Five members serve on the board?two elected and three appointed by the Governor. Board members receive no salary. When board members travel to required meetings, transportation and per diem expenses are paid by the retirement system. The board meets in Anchorage, Juneau and occasionally in other cities in Alaska.

Responsibilities of the board include: reviewing the operations of the system (AS 39.35), adopting resolutions and regulations, hearing appeals from members, approving actuarial reports, prescribing policies for the system and exercising duties set out in AS 39.30.155 and AS 39.45.025 for the Supplemental Benefits System and for the Deferred Compensation Plan for state employees.

This election will be conducted in accordance with 02 AAC 35.015. Candidates must be members of the PERS as defined in AS 39.35.680(21) and nominated by a petition signed by at least 25 PERS members.

Nominating petitions must be received in the Juneau office by 5 P.M., November 22, 1999. A petition must include the nominee?s name and address; a statement of the nominee?s willingness to serve; a biographical narrative not to exceed 150 words; and the printed names, signatures, and addresses of at least 25 PERS members.

Nominating petitions should be received early so that nominees can correct illegible or incomplete petitions before the November 22, 1999, deadline. A mailed nominating petition should be sent by certified mail. Petitions received and in need of corrections after the deadline will not be accepted.

Ballots will be mailed to eligible members in January 2000.

The due date for ballots will be clearly marked on the ballot mailer sent to each eligible voter.

If a candidate does not receive a majority of the votes, the division will hold a runoff election of the top two candidates within 20 business days of the first ballot count.

Location: The plant is located 1.5 miles west of Nome, Alaska, on the north side of Norton Sound; Section 26, Township 11 South, Range 34 West, Kateel River Meridian; Lat. 6430? N, Long. 16525?W; intersection of West K Street and West 5th Street, Nome, Alaska.

Activity: The Snake River Power Plant supplies electrical power to the residents of Nome, Alaska. The fuel burning equipment currently operating at the Snake River power plant facility includes five diesel electric generators. In the preliminary permit, NJUS requests: 1) the approval to operate a sixth diesel electric generator; 2) the discretion to increase the rated capacity of an existing source from 3,660 kW to 4,400 kW; and 3) operational restrictions on two generators. The Department conducted a Best Available Control Technology (BACT) review for NOX and SO2 on four generators. The project, as described in their application, will not require permits or approvals from other resource agencies.

Emissions: As permitted, the proposed potential to emit will not exceed 1345.7 tons per year (tpy) nitrogen oxides (NOx), 226 tpy sulfur dioxide (SO2), 68.7 tpy particulate matter (PM), 107.1 tpy carbon monoxide (CO), and 30.4 tpy volatile organic compounds (VOC). To protect SO2 ambient standards and increments, the applicant proposes to burn distillate fuel oil with a maximum sulfur content on 0.50% by weight.

Department Preliminary Review: Based on review of NJUS?s Construction Permit Application, ADEC is issuing a preliminary permit decision to issue Construction Permit No. 9932-AC013 and authorize the project.

Based on pre-construction review by ADEC, the permitted air contaminant emissions resulting from the project will:

- 1. comply with State Emission Standards applicable to this project;
- 2. be controlled by BACT for NOX and SO2;
- 3. comply with Ambient Air Quality Standards and PSD increments; and

The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (ADEC) is hosting a public workshop on the groundwater contamination at Six Mile Richardson Highway. The workshop is scheduled for Saturday, October 16, 1999, in the commons area of Ticasuk Brown Elementary School (785 Lakloey Dr.) between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. The purpose of the workshop is to present the latest information from site investigations and to solicit public comment on possible cleanup alternatives. The comment period will end November 16, 1999. ADEC will consider the public comments in selecting a cleanup alternative and in obtaining cleanup funds.

#### PURPOSE OF PUBLIC WORKSHOP

There is a one-mile-long groundwater contaminant plume in the Six-Mile Richardson area. The primary

contaminant of concern is trichloroethylene (TCE), a chlorinated solvent. There are other contaminants within the plume, however they are either not as extensive, or pose a lesser risk than TCE. The other contaminants are 1,1,1-trichloroethane (TCA), breakdown products of TCE and TCA, and some soluble components of petroleum hydrocarbons. A number of residential water wells in the Six-Mile Village Subdivision are affected.

The purpose of this public workshop is to:

 inform residents and other interested parties of the results of the 1998-1999 TCE groundwater contamination investigation,

 share information on possible cleanup alternatives for the soil and groundwater contamination, and

 hear public input on the cleanup alternatives.

The investigation results and cleanup (remedial) alternatives are briefly summarized below. Please attend the workshop to obtain more information, to ask questions and discuss results, and to express your opinion.

SIX MILE RICHARDSON HIGHWAY SITE INVESTIGATION

Shannon & Wilson (ADEC?s consultant) conducted a study on four separate properties in the Six Mile Richardson Highway area in 1998 and 1999 to:

 determine the extent of the trichloroethylene (TCE) groundwater contamination,

 locate its sources, and

 evaluate possible remedial alternatives.

During the investigation, four main areas of TCE-contaminated soil (source areas) were found on two properties at the south side of the Richardson Highway. These sources are the cause of the plume of TCE-contaminated groundwater. High levels of TCE (up to 499 parts per billion (ppb)) were measured in the groundwater near the source areas. These areas of soil contamination are probably the result of past spills, leaks, or disposal of used solvents to the ground surface.

#### LONG TERM MONITORING OF TCE & OTHER CONTAMINANTS

Since 1996, ADEC has sampled selected residential wells and permanent monitoring wells as part of a long-term groundwater-monitoring program. The 1999 results continue to show that the TCE plume is stable in size (possibly shrinking in size in some areas), and TCE groundwater concentrations are decreasing with time. Shannon & Wilson is presently evaluating the ?natural attenuation? rate (i.e., concentration decrease over time) of TCE. The concentration decreases appear to be largely due to physical processes (dispersion, dilution, and sorption) of the contaminant plume, however there is evidence that natural biological destruction of TCE is occurring in the plume as well.

#### POSSIBLE CLEANUP ALTERNATIVES

Several options for reducing TCE soil and groundwater levels are being considered by ADEC and are listed below. The options were evaluated on their effectiveness, ease of implementation, and estimated cost. There are several combinations of source area and groundwater treatment that could be used together.

#### Groundwater Treatment

The goal of groundwater cleanup is to reduce TCE concentrations below the 5-ppb cleanup level near the sources. The groundwater point of compliance (where groundwater should meet cleanup levels) has been selected at the respective property boundaries, about one half of a mile upgradient of the Six-Mile Village Subdivision. The alternatives are devised to remediate groundwater at or the near the source areas, and then to allow the natural groundwater flow to carry the ?cleaned water? to the Six Mile Village Subdivision area.

The following remedial alternatives are being considered to treat contaminated groundwater on the source area properties and in the regional plume:  Limited Groundwater Monitoring (no ?active? remediation)  Monitored Natural Attenuation of Groundwater with Groundwater Modeling (no ?active? remediation)
 Air Injection Treatment of Groundwater
 Air Injection/Vapor Extraction Treatment of Groundwater
 Potassium Permanganate Treatment of Groundwater

Source Area Treatment

The goal of soil cleanup is to meet ADEC soil cleanup levels for TCE within the source areas. Since the soil contamination is the cause of the groundwater contamination, treating the soil will speed up groundwater treatment. The following treatment alternatives are being considered to treat contaminated soils on the source area properties:  Source Area Excavation and Off-Site Disposal

 Source Area Excavation and Off-Site Thermal Remediation  Air Injection/Vapor Extraction of Source Areas
