

**Land Use Permit Application Supplemental Questionnaire for:
Use of Uplands and Non Marine Waters**

Temporary Structures – 1) Describe all temporary improvements (including buildings, tent platforms, out-buildings, docks, floats, and floating facilities), including their dimensions and building materials. 2) Label improvements to be maintained on a year round basis as year round. **Note:** Seasonal improvements must be completely dismantled and removed or stored on or before the end of authorized terms of use.

There are two temporary Snack shelters located on tract C of the permitted area. One structure is approximately 40' x 30'. The other structure is approximately 40' x 40, these structures are designed to provide shelter from the rain and have a temporary cover during the operating season. Each snack structure has a small covered storage structure, approximately 5' x 10', adjacent to them. There are docks positioned on tract C and B of the permitted area to facilitate loading of the canoes. The two docks located on tract C are 65' and 45' in length, both are 5' wide. The docks on tract B are configured as shown on the included diagram. The main finger is approximately 65' in length and 5' in width. There are two additional fingers attached to the main dock which measure approximately 35'in length and 5' in width. The finger used to connect these pieces is approximately 35' in length and 5' wide.

No long term vehicle parking is anticipated. Short term parking is planned in conjunction with this permit. Storage of the docks located on tract C of the permitted area is planned during non operational months (October through April). Docks will be disassembled and stored on tract C well above the high water line of the lake.
