

 - c. Consider removing the exception allowing for dead king salmon to be taken but not retained in the Yukon Area Districts 1-3 commercial dip net and beach seine summer chum salmon fishery. (newly assigned Proposal 373 formerly ACR9)
- C. IN THE BRISTOL BAY FINFISH SPORT FISHERY: In the Bristol Bay Sport Fishery, consider modifying the time period the Nushagak River single-hook restriction is in effect. (newly assigned Proposal 374 formerly ACR12)
