Amend Page 7 -

Remove:

DEFECTIVE WORK: Failure to provide any of the services described herein will cause the agency receiving the services and/or managing the contract, to issue a written Deficiency Claim to the janitorial Contractor. A copy of the Deficiency Claim must be sent to the Procurement Specialist in the DHSS Procurement Office. If the deficiency is not corrected within 6 hours of notification it will constitute a Valid Deficiency Claim (VDC).

More than (3) three VDC's in a 60 day period or a total of (7) seven VDC's in a (6) six month period may be grounds for the state to declare the Contractor in default and cancel the contract.

Any deficiency correction required shall be accomplished immediately after inspection or at a time acceptable to the State after receipt of a VDC.

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If a deficiency is not corrected within 24 hours of notification the state may hire another janitorial firm to correct the deficiency and deduct that cost from the next payment due under the contract.

Amended To Read:

DEFECTIVE WORK: Failure to provide any of the services described will cause the Procurement Officer to issue a written warning to the janitorial contractor. A copy of the warning will be sent to the Divisions Program Manager. If the deficiency is not corrected within 12 hours of notification it will constitute a warning.

More than three (3) warnings in 60 day period may be grounds for the State to declare the Contractor in default.

If a deficiency is not corrected within 24 hours of notification the State may hire another janitorial firm to correct the deficiency and deduct that cost from the next payment due under the contract.
