Subject: Alleged Violations of Alaska Campaign Finance Laws – Failure to File Accurate Reports, Failure to Disclose Real Campaign Expenditures, and Funding Unlawful Personal Expenditures

Sworn Statement: I, Vickie Clay, swear or affirm under penalty of perjury that the information contained in this complaint is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief, based on publicly available information, campaign disclosure reports filed with the Alaska Public Offices Commission (APOC), and other verifiable sources. This complaint is submitted in good faith and not for any improper purpose.

Basis for Complaint: This complaint alleges violations of Alaska Statutes (AS) 15.13.040, 15.13.112, and 15.13.116, as well as Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) regulations 2 AAC 50.320, 2 AAC 50.321, and 2 AAC 50.990, by George Martinez in his campaign for re-election to the Anchorage Assembly in the 2026 municipal election. The allegations stem from Martinez's Year Start Report filed on or about February 17, 2026 (amended filing date), which appears to include inaccurate descriptions of expenditures, potentially misclassified non-campaign-related spending, and possible use of campaign funds for personal benefit. These issues were identified through review of public APOC filings, corporate records, and airline promotional materials.

I respectfully request that APOC investigate these allegations, require Martinez to provide supporting documentation (e.g., receipts, invoices, and travel itineraries), determine if violations occurred, and impose appropriate remedies, including but not limited to civil penalties, corrective filings, and disgorgement of improperly used funds.

I. Overview of Laws Allegedly Violated

Alaska's campaign finance laws, administered by APOC, require candidates to accurately report contributions and expenditures, ensure funds are used solely for legitimate campaign purposes, and maintain detailed records to promote transparency and prevent misuse. The following statutes and regulations are implicated:

- **AS 15.13.040 (Contributions, expenditures, and supplying of services to be reported):** This statute requires candidates to file full reports on prescribed forms, listing the date, amount, and purpose of all expenditures. Reports must include sufficient detail

to allow the public and APOC to verify that expenditures are campaign-related. Vague or inaccurate descriptions may violate this provision by failing to provide a "full report" of campaign activity. For expenditures over certain thresholds, additional specificity is needed to ensure compliance.

- **AS 15.13.112 (Uses of campaign contributions held by candidate or group):** This prohibits the use of campaign contributions for personal expenses or non-campaign purposes. Contributions may only be used to pay legitimate expenses of the candidate or group, such as influencing the outcome of an election. Prohibited uses include personal income, obligations unrelated to the campaign, or benefits that primarily serve the candidate's personal interests (e.g., enhancing personal travel status). Violations can result in civil penalties and requirements to reimburse the campaign.
- **AS 15.13.116 (Disbursement of campaign assets after election):** While primarily addressing post-election disposition of unused funds, this statute reinforces that campaign assets must be disbursed in accordance with allowable uses under AS 15.13.112. It prohibits retaining or transferring funds for personal benefit and requires reporting of any disbursements.
- **2 AAC 50.320 (Recordkeeping requirements):** This regulation mandates that candidates maintain detailed records of all expenditures, including receipts, invoices, and documentation sufficient to substantiate the campaign-related purpose. Records must be retained for six years and made available for APOC inspection. Failure to keep adequate records can lead to findings of inaccurate reporting.
- **2 AAC 50.321 (Reporting by a candidate, group, or nongroup entity):** This requires candidates to file reports that accurately describe each expenditure, including the vendor, amount, date, and a detailed purpose. For services like advertising or promotion, the report must specify the nature of the service to ensure it aligns with campaign activities. Misclassification (e.g., labeling a non-promotional expense as "advertisement") violates this rule.
- **2 AAC 50.990 (Definitions):** This provides key definitions, including "expenditure" (anything of value used to influence an election) and "contribution" (funds or services provided for campaign use). These definitions underscore that personal benefits, such as airline status upgrades, do not qualify as campaign expenditures.

These laws collectively ensure transparency, accountability, and the proper use of campaign funds. Violations undermine public trust in the electoral process and may subject the candidate to fines up to \$500 per day for late or inaccurate reports (AS 15.13.390), as well as other sanctions.

On or about February 17, 2026, Assembly member George Martinez filed (and amended) a campaign disclosure to comply with the 2026 Campaign Year Start Report, detailing his campaign's net income of approximately \$11,327 and expenditures totaling approximately \$5,634.

II. Description of Allegations and Basis of Knowledge

The following allegations are based on Martinez's APOC Year Start Report (filed February 17, 2026), publicly available corporate records from the Florida Division of Corporations, information from CHOOOSE INC.'s website and partnerships, Alaska Airlines promotional materials, and media reports on campaign finance disclosures. No confidential or privileged information was used. Documents are attached.

1. **Campaign Expenditure on 12/29/2025**

- a. **Company:** Alaska Airlines
- b. **Total Expenditure:** \$1,255.70
- c. **Purpose:** "Travel"
- d. **Allegation 1:** While "travel" may suffice for some expenditures, AS 15.13.040 and 2 AAC 50.321 require sufficient detail to confirm the campaign-related purpose, especially in a local municipal election where out-of-area travel is uncommon. The description does not specify the destination, traveler (candidate or another), or how it relates to campaign activities (e.g., attending a conference or voter outreach). Alaska Airlines primarily operates interstate and international flights, not local routes within Anchorage. Public records show no evidence of campaign events outside Anchorage requiring such travel during this period. Additionally, no complementary expenditures (e.g., lodging, meals, or rentals) are reported, which would typically accompany legitimate campaign travel. This raises concerns under AS 15.13.112 that the expenditure may have been personal, potentially linked to the subsequent payment to CHOOOSE INC. (Allegation 3-4)
- e. **Request:** I respectfully request APOC review underlying documentation to verify if this meets reporting requirements, if more specificity is needed, and if it was truly campaign-related or personal.

2. **Campaign Expenditure on 12/30/2025**

- a. **Company:** CHOOOSE INC., 3350 Virginia Street, Miami, FL 33133 (as reported)
- b. **Total Expenditure:** \$1,000.00
- c. **Purpose:** "Promotional / Advertisement"
- d. **Allegation 2:** The reported address (3350 Virginia Street) differs from CHOOOSE INC.'s actual principal address (3390 Mary Street, Suite 116, Miami, FL 33133), per Florida Division of Corporations records (File No. F23000002071). This inaccuracy violates AS 15.13.040 and 2 AAC 50.321, which require accurate vendor information.
- e. **Allegation 3:** CHOOOSE INC. is a climate technology company specializing in carbon emission management and Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF) solutions, partnering with Alaska Airlines for carbon offsets. No public information indicates it provides traditional advertising services. The "Promotional / Advertisement" description misrepresents the expenditure, potentially misleading the public about its nature (e.g., SAF credits rather than ads). Typical SAF offsets for a round-trip flight (e.g., Anchorage to Seattle) range from \$48 to \$480, suggesting the \$1,000 amount exceeds standard offsets.
- f. **Allegation 4:** During December 1–31, 2025, Alaska Airlines ran a promotion allowing Mileage Plan members to earn 500 elite-qualifying miles (EQMs) or status points per \$100 contributed to SAF via CHOOOSE, up to 5,000 points (\$1,000 max). This timing and exact amount suggest the expenditure may have been to maximize personal airline status benefits, violating AS 15.13.112's prohibition on personal use. It appears tied to the prior day's Alaska Airlines travel expense.
- g. **Request:** Due to discrepancies in address, description, and potential personal benefit, I request APOC review invoices/receipts to confirm:
 - (1) the specific service;
 - (2) if it was campaign-related or for personal benefit;

- (3) its association with the Alaska Airlines expenditure;
- (4) proper categorization under AS 15.13.040; and
- (5) accurate vendor details.

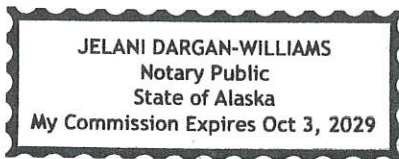
III. Requested Relief

- Require Martinez to amend reports with accurate details.
- Impose penalties if violations are found.
- Direct reimbursement of any personal-use funds.
- Any other relief APOC deems appropriate.

Alaska Airlines announced today it is partnering with climate-tech company CHOOOSE to provide new options for sustainability-minded guests to take action on their travel-related carbon emissions by purchasing sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) credits or support nature-based climate projects.

A banner on the reservations confirmation page invites guests to learn more about the carbon emissions generated by their own prior or upcoming travel (with emission calculations based on the International Air Transport Association (IATA)'s carbon emissions methodology. Guests can choose between SAF credits or from certified nature-based projects in geographies where the airline flies, such as Doyon Native Community Forest Project,

Freres Biochar, The Guatemalan Conservation Coast, and more.

Alaska is also rewarding guests who purchase a certain amount of SAF credits (i.e. SAF environmental attributes) with Elite Qualifying Miles (EQMs), as part of the airline's year-end elite status promotions, further reflecting its emphasis on scaling and leading the advancement of SAF.

Now through December 31, 2023, Alaska Mileage Plan members will earn 500 Elite-Qualifying Miles (EQMs) per \$100 of SAF credits purchased (with a 5,000 EQM limit). These funds will go toward the purchase and use of SAF while providing a sustainability-focused way to reach that year-end mileage target and earn elite status for the year ahead. We know that reaching our sustainability goals – including net-zero carbon emissions by 2040 – will require investment and action on all fronts, and that sustainable aviation fuel presents our best opportunity to take a leap forward on this journey,” said Diana Birkett Rakow, Senior Vice President, Public Affairs and Sustainability, Alaska. “But today, there isn’t enough SAF to meet demand – and we need to bring its cost down by creating scale. That’s why, in addition to purchasing and using SAF, building partnerships, and advocating for public policy support, we’re inviting our guests to join us – to learn more about SAF, to invest in its development, and to help us grow supply for the future. We’re excited to link this work to our loyalty plan, helping guests get closer to that next elite tier, in partnership with a creative innovator like CHOOOSE – and we look forward to building on this platform.”

Alaska has been a leader in advancing the market for SAF and was the first commercial U.S. airline to fly multiple routes using the alternative fuel in 2011. But there is still not enough SAF to support the industry's operational needs, and that must change to meet the goals we have set as an industry.

Since 2010, Alaska has worked with a coalition of partners to advance SAF – which produces up to 80% lower carbon emissions than traditional jet fuel – on multiple fronts including:

- The airlines' largest SAF purchase of 185 million gallons from producer Gevo, and an additional SAF purchase agreement with producer Aemetis;
- An agreement with E-Jet® company Twelve to collaborate on and execute the first commercial flight powered by E-Jet® fuel – produced using recaptured carbon;
- An agreement with Shell Aviation to expand the SAF market while working together to deepen the understanding of the technology, infrastructure, carbon accounting systems and public policy support needed to scale supply;
- And, partnerships with companies like [Microsoft](#) and others, to reduce emissions from business travel.

This step is part of Alaska's continued sustainability strategy, the company's "[EverGreen](#) journey", and includes immediate actions and long-term investments to reduce the carbon emissions of our operations, minimizing waste, and protecting local ecosystems. 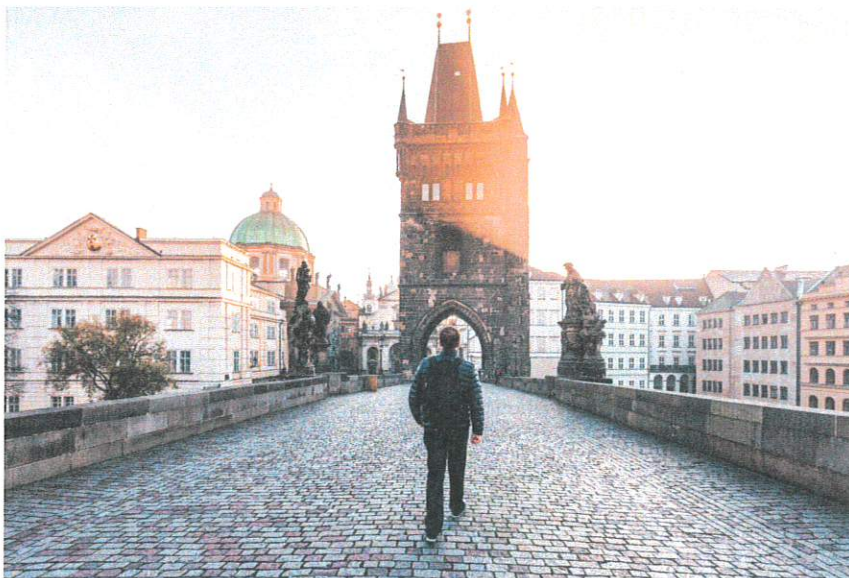
