DECISION AND ORDER UPON CONSENT OF THE PARTIES

L.L. appealed a Modified Administrative Child Support issued by the Child Support Services Division (Division) on November 5, 2022. While his appeal raised several concerns, the only issue properly before this tribunal is his dispute regarding the calculation of his monthly support obligation for I.G., the child he shares with D.G. The November 5 Support Order raised his support from \$763 per month based on primary custody to \$1,291, effective October 1, 2022. A telephonic hearing took place on January 18, 2023. D.G. participated and represented herself. L.L. participated and was represented by his attorney, Q.Q. The Division was represented by Child Support Specialist Mark Phang.

Prior to the hearing Mr. Phang distributed to the parties an amended calculation of L.L.'s support calculation parties based on additional paystubs submitted into the record. During the hearing there was testimony regarding L.L.'s pay schedule and monthly deductions from his paychecks, factors which had a negative impact on his projected 2022 annual earnings. As a result, it became clear the amended calculations submitted by Mr. Phang were slightly inflated. Applying the appropriate pay schedule and the deductions as listed in his paychecks, the parties concurred that a more accurate calculation of L.L.'s 2022 wages resulted in a monthly support obligation for I.G. of \$1,008 based on a primary custody calculation.

D.G., L.L. and the Division indicated on the record that \$1,008 per month as L.L.'s ongoing support obligation for I.G. was wholly acceptable. The administrative law judge has reviewed the parties' settlement and concurs that it is fair and appropriate under Civil Rule 90.3. Thus, the parties' settlement is adopted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. L.L. is liable for child support in the amount of \$1,008 per month for one child beginning October 1, 2022, and ongoing using a primary custody calculation.

2. All other terms of the Modified Administrative Child and Medical Support Order dated November 5, 2022, remain in full force and effect.
