The Appellant, [S.I.] appealed the Office of Administrative Hearings

(OAH) Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Christopher Kennedy's March 22, 2023,

Decision affirming the Permanent Fund Dividend Division's denial of Mr. I's 2022

Permanent Fund Dividend (PFD) application. This court has jurisdiction over this appeal pursuant to AS 22.10.020(d) and Appellate Rule 602(a)(2). For the reasons set forth below, Judge Kennedy's March 22, 2023 decision affirming the Permanent Fund Dividend Division's Denial of Appellant's 2022 PFD application is AFFIRMED.


The court having reviewed the Parties briefs, concurs with the Appellee's summary, analysis and conclusion and, seeing no utility in repeating the same herein, adopts the State's brief as its own.

The record and law are clear: Pursuant to AS 43.23.005(d)(2)(a), Mr. I. was not eligible for the 2022 PFD because he was incarcerated in Alaska for a felony during the qualifying year 2021. Therefore, Judge Kennedy's March 22, 2023 decision

affirming the Permanent Fund Dividend Division's Denial of Appellant's 2022 PFD application is AFFIRMED.
