AMENDED DECISION AND ORDER UPON CONSENT OF THE PARTIES¹

Custodial parent D. K. appealed a Modified Administrative Child Support Order issued by the Child Support Services Division (Division) on May 21, 2022, increasing Mr. U.'s monthly support obligation for their daughter N. from \$705 to \$866. Ms. K. asserted that the calculation did not include all of Mr. U.'s sources of income, including his military retirement benefits.

A telephonic hearing was held on August 11, 2022. Ms. K. appeared by telephone and represented herself, as did Mr. U.. The Division was represented by Child Support Specialist Mark Phang.

The parties settled the appeal. The Division submitted a new calculation that included Mr. U.'s expected 2022 wage income of \$55,465.33, a \$3,200 Alaska PFD, and \$20,784 in native dividends and retirement benefits, for a total gross annual income of \$79,449.33. After allowable deductions, this resulted in an adjusted annual income of \$64,306.53, and a monthly child support obligation for N. of \$1,072.00.²

Both parties accepted this support calculation and agreed to its adoption. This figure is based on Mr. U.'s actual wage income, verified benefits, and confirmed Alaska PFD. The support amount was calculated under Civil Rule 90.3(a), without variation. The parties' agreement is supported by the evidence, and the administrative law judge concludes that it should be adopted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. M. U. is liable for child support in the amount of \$1,072.00 per month for one child effective July 1, 2022, and ongoing.
2. All other terms of the Modified Administrative Child Support Order issued on May 21, 2022, remain in full force and effect.
