The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) intends to adopt the Kenai Area Plan on or after January 3, 2000. The plan designates land uses and sets management intent and guidelines for approximately 5.3 million acres of state lands in the Kenai Peninsula Borough.

The plan classifies or reclassifies state-owned uplands, tidelands, shorelands, and submerged lands within the Kenai Planning Area. The Department will also close approximately 42 acres of state shorelands (streambeds) to mineral entry on the lower Russian River in accordance with AS 38.05.185(a). The Department will restrict new mining locations on the beds and within 200 feet of six river systems (approximately 8,700 acres) to leasehold locations under AS 38.05.205. Additional stipulations on mining will apply to these leasehold location areas. The six rivers are: Kasilof River, Ninilchik River, Stariski Creek, Deep Creek, Anchor River, and upper Russian River.

The plan also establishes three new Special Use Land designations under 11 AAC 96.010(b) for the state-owned tidelands and submerged lands in Resurrection Bay and along the outer coast of the Kenai Peninsula, the tidelands and submerged lands adjacent to Lake Clark National Park and Preserve, and on state-owned uplands along the Exit Glacier Road.

Where the Kenai Area Plan boundaries overlap with existing DNR area and management plans in the planning area (Susitna Area Plan, Bristol Bay Area Plan, Prince William Sound Area Plan, Deep Creek Area Management Plan, and the Nuka Island and Vicinity Management Plan), these plans are amended under 11 AAC 55.030 and superseded by the Kenai Area Plan.

The Kenai Area Plan incorporates the Caribou Hills Management Plan and makes minor changes to the plan intent and boundary under 11 AAC 55.030. This action also makes minor changes to the Caribou Hills Special Use Lands designated under 11 AAC 96.010(b). Policies and guidelines from existing DNR Site-Specific Plans are incorporated into the Kenai Area Plan with some minor changes to intent and guidelines.
