In accordance with the authority of the regulations attorney under AS 44.62.125(b), please forward to the publisher the corrections to the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) described below. I have forwarded these corrections under a specific delegation dated December 1, 2015 from the regulations attorney. These revisions correct manifest errors.

The regulation to be revised is 3 AAC 28.690. One manifest error appears in the printed Alaska Administrative Code, but not in the electronic database; a different manifest error appears in the electronic database, but not in the printed Alaska Administrative Code. The revisions to 3 AAC 28.690 are as follows:

--In 3 AAC 28.690 as it appears in the printed Alaska Administrative Code, please restore the missing history note. The history note would appear before the authority citation. The history note appears in its proper position in the electronic database.

-- In 3 AAC 28.690 as it appears in the electronic database, the tabular content of Appendices 1 - 4 is missing; please insert the missing content, or insert .pdf links to the appendices as is done with some tables. This omission appears in the electronic database only; the full content of the appendices appears where it should in the printed Alaska Administrative Code.

At the end of the editor's note that follows 3 AAC 28.690, add a new paragraph to read:

> As of Register 218 (July 2016), the regulations attorney made technical corrections under AS 44.62.125(b)(6), to 3 AAC 28,690.
