NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES ON CHALLENGING COURSES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION & EARLY DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Education & Early Development proposes to adopt regulation changes in 4 AAC 06.065(a) of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with challenging courses, including the following:

1. 4 AAC 06.065(a) is proposed to be changed by replacing "secondary students" with "students in grades nine through 12" to conform the regulation to the similar change in state law under Secs. 2-3, ch. 2, SSSLA 2015. Under that legislation, school districts are required to provide an opportunity to challenge courses only to students in grades 9-12, rather than to "secondary school" students. Under state law, a "secondary school" may include grades seven or eight.

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to the Commissioner's Office, Department of Education & Early Development, Attn: Regulations Review, 801 West Tenth Street, Suite 200, PO Box 110500, Juneau, Alaska 99811-0500. 
