



The Department of Education & Early Development proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code to repeal the requirement that districts implement a pilot program related to the incorporation of student learning data in educator evaluations.

Currently, 4 AAC 19.010(k), which took effect October 9, 2015, requires districts to implement a pilot program to develop a system for the use of student learning data in educator evaluations. The intent of this change is to repeal the pilot program requirement under 4 AAC 19.010(k), with the repeal taking effect for the 2015-2016 school year.
