In accordance with the authority of the regulations attorney under AS 44.62.125(b), please forward to the publisher the correction to the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) described below. I have forwarded this correction under a specific delegation dated December 1, 2015 from the regulations attorney. This revision corrects a manifest printing error.

The regulation to be revised is 17 AAC 42.035(b). The revision that subsection is as follows:

-- Delete the material displayed as paragraphs (1) - (4).

After 17 AAC 42.035, insert an editor's note to read:

Editor's note: As of Register 220 (January 2017), the regulations attorney made a technical correction under AS 44.62.125(b)(6), to 17 AAC 42.035(b).

This edit is necessary to correct an error that the publisher made when printing amendments to 17 AAC 42.035(b) that took effect January 17, 2016 and first appeared in Register 217 (April 2016). I have confirmed from the filed regulations that the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities repealed and readopted 17 AAC 42.035(b) altogether, without splitting the new material into paragraphs. When printing the repealed and readopted version of 17 AAC 42.035(b) in the April 2016 quarterly supplement (Register 217) and the new July 2016 main pamphlet (Register 218), the publisher forgot to delete the text expressed as (1) -(4) of former 17 AAC 42.035(b).
