 - 2016 Lower Yukon Fishery Report: ADF&G Comm. Fish
 - O Jeff Estensen (ADF&G) reported that 2016 preliminary estimates indicated a run size of 1.4 million fall chum and escapement goals were expected to have been met. Districts 1 and 2 caught approximately 440,000 fall chum salmon in the commercial fishery. Overall, Mr. Estensen reported a good year for fall chum and coho salmon on the Yukon.
 - O Holly Carroll (ADF&G) commented that 2016 subsistence reports indicated that people more than doubled their harvest from 2015. Ms. Carroll reported that the Chinook salmon boarder goal with Canada was met. Ms. Carroll commented that the drainage-wide escapement goal for summer chum was expected to have been exceeded and the commercial fishery for summer chum, which was restricted to dipnet and beach seine gear, had a record harvest of summer chum and pink salmon. Ms. Carroll invited the public to share traditional knowledge and information with ADF&G.
 - Western Region, Game Management Unit 18, BOG Proposals and AC comments: (See p. 3-4)
 - ACR 12: Extend the Moose Hunting Season in Unit 18, Kuskokwim Area to September 30. (See Proposal 160 on p. 4))
 - Elect AC Representative and Alternate to Attend 2017 BOG/ BOF Meetings. Ray Oney was
 elected to attend the BOG meeting in Bethel. Eric Olsen and Daryl Manumik will serve as
 alternates.
 - Federal/ State Subsistence MOU Revisions:
 - Comments: John Lamont commented on conservation and mapping projects that occur looking at different issues such as over land traffic and studies on the natural resources. Ray Oney commented that the state and federal governments should be working closely with the tribes; often times the tribes work on projects that the state and federal governments are unaware of. Eric Olsen commented that Elders are very resourceful and the state/ federal governments should be working with the Elders on renewable resources.
