We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. The regulations update requirements regarding certification by examination, certification by credentials, continuing education, and screening of newborns for congenital heart defects.

We have received confirmation from agency staff to defer our review of amendments to 12 AAC 14.130(g) to another regulations project, pending additional board work on those provisions. Except for the amendments proposed for 12 AAC 14.530(a) and (e), we find no legal problems with the rest of the regulations. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

We have disapproved the amendments proposed for 12 AAC 14.530(a) and (e). Currently, 12 AAC 14.530(a) requires a certified direct-entry midwife to consult a physician if an infant has health difficulties listed under that subsection, and 12 AAC 14.530(e) requires that a certified direct-entry midwife recommend to a client that a physician evaluate the infant within one week of birth or sooner if the infant's need for medical attention is apparent. The proposed amendments to 12 AAC 14.530(a) and (e) would replace "a physician" with "a pediatric care provider". But a definition or substantive provision addressing a "pediatric care provider" does not appear in the current regulations or the proposed amendments, and the term does not appear anyplace else in the Alaska Statutes or Alaska Administrative Code. Without a definition or substantive clarification, the term could include not only physicians but also, for example,

nurses, paraprofessionals, and dentists. Some of these professionals may be qualified to consult with a certified direct-entry midwife or the midwife's client with respect to the infant's issues; others may not. But because the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives proposes the term "pediatric care provider" without additional details, the proposed amendments unintentionally could put an infant's health at risk, should a provider lack the skills and qualifications appropriate to address the infant's issues. Accordingly, we have disapproved proposed 12 AAC 14.530(a) and (e).

The April 23, 2016 public notice and the June 3, 2016 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made a technical correction to conform the rest of the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The correction is shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

On a motion made by Kathryn Roberts, seconded by Jennifer Swander it was resolved to enter in executive session in accordance with the provisions of Alaska Statute 44.62.310(c) for the purpose of discussing matters which by law, municipal charter, or ordinance are required to be confidential. Board staff Renee Hoffard to remain in the room.

Division Director Janey Hovenden joined the meeting to discuss the program's fee analysis in preparation of the program's upcoming renewal. Director Hovenden explained that the fees for the program are set by the division in regulation and that each program's licensure fees are used to pay the administrative costs of the licensing program. The Direct-Entry Midwife program has run in a deficit for the past several renewal cycles and it is imperative that they resolve that debt. All costs of the licensing program are the responsibility of licensees of the program and therefore must be paid from license and renewal fees. At this time the division feels that the best way to reduce the program debt is to increase all fees for the program and to charge a one-time special assessment or surcharge to licensed Direct-Entry Midwives. The one-time fee will be \$4,000.00.

Jennifer Swander had to leave the conference call at 10:05 am.

Director Hovenden and Chair Schneider both expressed their concern regarding licensees being able to pay such a large sum at one time since the renewal of their license would be dependent upon paying that as well as an increased renewal fee. After discussion with the board it was determined that the division would recommend the one-time surcharge be due December 31, 2018 for the 2018 renewal cycle. Should a Direct-Entry Midwife not pay the fee by then, their license would not be renewed for the next licensing cycle. This would allow CDM's that need to pay the \$4,000.00 in payments that meet the needs of their budget and allow them to continue their practice.

The board agreed to vote on agreeing with the division's fee assessment via email due to Ms. Swander's excused absence. Renee was tasked with emailing the proposed plan to the board no later than 2:00 pm June 3, 2016.

Director Hovenden asked that board members should include any specific points they want included in the cover letter that will be sent to licensees with the proposed regulations changes regarding the fee increases.

Chair Schneider recommended that the meeting adjourn as only she and Kathryn Roberts were still in attendance. The meeting ended at 10:29 am.
