In accordance with the authority of the regulations attorney under AS 44.62.125(b), please forward to the publisher the correction to the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC) described below. I have forwarded this correction under a specific delegation dated December 1, 2015 from the regulations attorney. This revision corrects a manifest error in a reference to a law.

The regulation to be revised is 8 AAC 15.910(a)(2) (definition of "casual employee"). The revision to that paragraph is as follows:

--Change "AS 23.10.065(11)" to "AS 23.10.060(d)(11)"

In addition, in the editor's note following 8 AAC 15.910, please add a new paragraph at the end to read as follows:

As of Register 221 (April 2017), the regulations attorney made a technical correction under AS 44.62.125(b)(6), to 8 AAC 15.910(a).

The above change is necessary to reflect the actual location of the term "casual employees" in AS 23.10. Although the clerical error in the regulations is old, I have confirmed that the only appearance of "casual employees" in the Alaska Statutes is in AS 23.10.060(d)(11). The phrase does not appear anywhere in singular number, and does not appear anywhere in AS 23.10.065. Also, AS 23.10.065(d) does not break out into a list of paragraphs. Only a crossreference to AS 23.10.060(d)(11) can be harmonized with the definition of "casual employee" in 8 AAC 15.910(a).
