THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND EARLY DEVELOPMENT





4 AAC 58.010 ^(ca) is amended to read:

(a) The admission fee to the Alaska State Museum is \$7 [\$5] per visit. The admission fee to the Sheldon Jackson Museum is \$5 [\$3] per visit. However, during the period in the summer months in which the Alaska State Museum and Sheldon Jackson Museum have extended hours, the admission fee to the Alaska State Museum is \$12 and the admission fee to the Sheldon Jackson Museum is \$7 [\$5]. The museums may not charge an admission fee to a person who is younger than 19 years of age. A \$1 discount is available to visitors who are 65 years of age or older.

4 AAC 58.010 (b) is amended to read:

(b) The fee for an annual pass to the Alaska State Museum and the Sheldon Jackson Museum is \$35 [\$25]. An annual pass allows the holder to visit both museums without paying an additional admission fee. An annual pass is valid for the calendar year in which it is issued.

(f) The Alaska State Museum and the Sheldon Jackson Museum shall charge a \$25 fee for use of a photograph in publishing, video production, exhibits, product presentations, interior design, digital format, advertising, or similar use, including for-profit work done by a consultant or commercial design firm on behalf of a government agency or a non-profit institution. The fee charged under this subsection is for one-time non-exclusive use and is levied in addition to other processing and service charges. The fee charged under this subsection applies whether the photographic image is provided by the state museums or is made by the user. The museum shall waive, in whole or in part, a fee for photographic use if the director of the departmental division that oversees libraries, archives, and museums determines that it is in the public interest.

(g) The Alaska State Museum and the Sheldon Jackson Museum shall charge a \$150 fee for the loan of an artifact to a museum. We have reviewed the attached regulations from the State Board of Education and Early Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a specific delegation dated May 4, 2017 from the Regulations Attorney. The regulations update fees for the Alaska State Museum and Sheldon Jackson Museum and establish fees for the use of space at the Father Andrew P. Kashevaroff State Library, Archives, and Museum building.

We find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The February 5, 2017 public notice, the February 23, 2017 supplemental public notice, and the April 5, 2017 certification of adoption order all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Sets fees to rent space at the Andrew P. Kashevaroff State Library, Archives, and Museums building in Juneau; sets admission fees and various service fees at the Alaska State Museums.

The Department of Education and Early Development proposes to adopt regulation changes to Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code dealing with fees at the Alaska State Museums, including the following:

4 AAC 58.010 is proposed to be amended to allow the Alaska State Museums to charge fees to recover costs for the rental of space at the Andrew P. Kashevaroff State Library, Archives, and Museums building in Juneau. The division may waive the fees.

4 AAC 58.010 is proposed to be amended to set fees for admission to the Alaska State Museum in Juneau and the Sheldon Jackson Museum in Sitka, and for various services from the Alaska State Museums. The museums may waive the fees.

The Department of Education and Early Development invites the public to submit written comments during the written comment period, which begins with the date of this notice and ends on March 8, at 4:30 p.m. The written comment period closes in advance of the meeting of the State Board of Education and Early Development at which the board will consider the adoption of the proposed regulations. This allows the Department of Education and Early Development an opportunity to prepare changes based on written comment and to distribute any proposed changes to the board for its consideration prior to the meeting.
