 - (A) the moose IM population objective established by the board for Unit 21(E) is 9,000–11,000 moose; the IM harvest objective for Unit 21(E) is 550–1,100 moose annually;

- (B) the density objective for moose in the WCFA is 1.0 per square mile (corrected for sightability) during late winter surveys; the annual moose harvest objective for the WCFA is 165;
- (C) the wolf control objective in the WCFA is to reduce wolf numbers by at least 60–80 percent; the pre-control estimate within the WCFA is 80 wolves; the pre-control wolf population in Unit 21(E) is estimated at 150; a minimum of 30 wolves post-control in Unit 21(E) will ensure that wolves persist in Unit 21(E);
- (D) the black bear control objective in the BCFA is to reduce black bear numbers to the lowest level possible; the pre-control black bear population in Unit 21(E) is estimated at 1,900–2,275; the pre-control estimate within the BCFA is 130–160; because the BCFA is a relatively small geographic area, removing black bears from within it will have only a minor effect on the black bear population in Unit 21(E);
- (E) the brown bear control objective in the BCFA is to reduce brown bear numbers to the lowest level possible; the pre-control brown bear population in Unit 21(E) is estimated at 100–200; the pre-control estimate within the BCFA is 10–15; because the BCFA is a relatively small geographic area, removing brown bears from within it will have only a minor effect on the brown bear population in Unit 21(E);

- (A) a proactive approach is needed to allow for a timely response to a decline in the Unit 21(E) moose population if IM population and harvest objectives have not been met;

- (C) a reduction of wolf and bear predation within the WCFA and BCFA can reasonably be expected to make progress towards achieving the Unit 21(E) IM objectives;
- (D) reducing predation is likely to be effective and feasible using recognized and prudent active management techniques and based on scientific information;
- (E) reducing predation is likely to be effective given land ownership patterns;
- (5) if the moose density in Unit 21(E) declines to fewer than 1.0 moose per square mile (corrected for sightability) then authorized methods and means are as follows:
 - (A) hunting and trapping of wolves and hunting of black bears and brown bears by the public in Unit 21(E) during the term of this program may occur as provided in the hunting and trapping regulations set out elsewhere in this title, including use of motorized vehicles;

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Board of Game against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. The regulations concern hunting and trapping regulations for the Interior and Northeast Arctic Region.

Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The original December 3, 2016 affidavit of newspaper publication for these regulations was filed with Department of Law project file JU2016200589, Register 222 (July 2017); we have included a photocopy of that affidavit of publication.

Please note that the May 30, 2017 certification of adoption order sets out an effective date of July 1, 2017 for the regulations. Therefore, the history note following each section will need to reflect this date. This is the second of an expected three Board of Game regulations projects that will have amendments effective July 1, 2017. The publisher should pay strict attention to ensure that the changes to existing regulations are made in consecutive order so that the regulations are printed correctly in the July register.

The December 3, 2016 public notice and the May 30, 2017 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA BOARD OF GAME

Notice is given that the Alaska Board of Game, under the authority of Title 16, Alaska Statutes, proposes adopt, amend, or repeal regulations in Title 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the use a taking of game. Regulations subject to board action are in 5 AAC 84, 85, 92, 98 and 99 for the Arctic, Weste and Interior/Northeast Arctic Regions including statewide reauthorization of antierless moose hunts a brown bear tag fee exemptions, and statewide regulations as described below:

For the Arctic and Western Region, Game Management Units 18, 22, 23, and 26A, and the Interior/Northe Arctic Region Game, Management Units 12, 19, 20, 21, 24, 25, 26B, and 26C, the following subject matter ar to be addressed are:

- TRAPPING. SEASONS AND BAG LIMITS for furbearers, including: Lynx, wolverine, black bear, a wolves.
- B. HUNTING SEASONS AND BAG LIMITS for all species including: Moose, caribou, black bear, brown be Dall sheep, wolves, wolverine, fur animals, and small game. In addition, the potential for identify general, Tier I or Tier II hunting for each population.
- C. LICENSES, HARVEST TICKETS, HARVEST REPORTS, TAGS, FEES, AND PERMITS including: Discretior and required permit hunting and trapping conditions and procedures including guide-cile agreements for nonresidents hunting big game; special provisions for moose, brown bear, and D sheep permit hunts; permits and guide requirements for hunting black bear and brown bear with the use of balt or scent lures; harvest ticket requirements for sheep and caribou; community subsistentiarvest permit hunt areas; permits for hunting game with dogs; permits for harvesting moose for celebratory events; and permits for disabled veterans.
- D. METHODS AND MEANS FOR TAKING BIG GAME, GAME, FUR ANIMALS, AND FURBERAERS, includin Lawful methods of taking game, big game, and furbearers including restrictions for the use of aircrefor hunting caribou and sheep; use of crossbows, snow machines, and dogs for hunting; and sam day airborne taking of wolves and coyotes.
- E. POSSESSION, TRANSPORTATION, AND USE OF GAME including: Salvage requirements including edit meat for game birds, and requirements for bear taken over balt.
- F. RESTRICTED AREAS including: Areas closed to hunting and trapping including the establishing a closed areas for taking wolves near Denali National Park and caribou along the Taylor Highwa management areas including the Dalton Highway Corridor Management Area; permits for qualific disabled veterans and disabled active-duty military personnel in the Delta Junction Management Area and establishing new management areas for Chena Slough and Eielson Farm Road; controlled us areas including boundaries and regulating use within the Noatak Controlled Use Area; restrictions for the use of boats in the Holitna-Hoholltna Controlled Use Area; and authorized alroots in the Uppe Kuskokwim Controlled Use Area.
- G. INTENSIVE MANAGEMENT AND PREDATOR CONTROL IMPLEMENTATION PLANS including: Prepopulations and populations having a positive finding as identified big game prey population including the Delta caribou herd; predation control areas implementation plans including nonresider wolf tag requirements; and related findings.
- H. CUSTOMARY AND TRADITIONAL USES OF GAME POPULATIONS including: Brown bear in Unit 2! Emperor geese; and amounts reasonably necessary for subsistence uses for the Teshekpuk an Western Arctic caribou herds.
- i. ADDITIONAL TOPICS: In addition to items described above, the board of Game will address the following topics for other units which were approved through the agenda change request process, of in the case of antierless moose hunts and brown bear tag fees, must be authorized annually. Annual reauthorization of antierless moose hunts and brown bear tag fee exemptions for all units statewide seasons, bag limits, and a customary and traditional use finding for Emperor geese (proposal 157 testing requirements for raptors (proposal 158); modifications to the Mulchatna caribou herd and the Unit 15C intensive management plans and objectives (proposals 155 and 156); and hunter orientation requirements for moose in Unit 15 (proposal 159). In addition, the board will consider statewide bay limits for residents and nonresident second degree of kindred relatives (proposals 19 and 49) which may be amended to apply statewide.

The board will also take action on non-regulatory items during the meetings such as resolutions, findings letters, and delegations, typically at the end of the meeting under miscellaneous business but action may occur earlier in the meeting if necessary.

Additional information will be added to the meeting websites as it becomes available for each meeting.

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The public hearing portion of the meetings is scheduled at the beginning of each meeting following staff reports, and will continue until everyone who has signed up and is present when called has been given the opportunity to be heard. However, state advisory committee representatives may elect to provide testimony at a later portion of the meetings. Additional public hearings may be held throughout the meetings just before consideration and adoption of proposed changes in the regulations. The board will take oral testimony only from those who register before the cut-off time announced by the board chair at the meeting. The length of oral statements may be limited to three to five minutes, or less for the public and 10 to 15 minutes or less for fish and game advisory committee representatives.
