

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Board of Marine Pilots against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a specific delegation dated June 1, 2017 from the Regulations Attorney. The regulations update requirements involving continuing education and crimes involving moral turpitude.

We find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The April 5, 2017 public notice and the May 11, 2017 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations. In the list of new crimes of moral turpitude added to 12 AAC 79.910, we note that the deletion of "criminal homicide" is not substantive. Rather, the deletion eliminates redundancy because 12 AAC 79.910(1) and (13) already identify "homicide" and "murder" as crimes involving moral turpitude. We have received confirmation from the department staff that the deletion is technical.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The Board of Massage Therapists proposes to update regulations regarding continuing education requirements for renewal, crimes involving moral turpitude, and definitions.

The Board of Massage Therapists (Board) proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 12, Chapter 79, of the Alaska Administrative Code including the following:

- 1. 12 AAC 79.210. Continuing education requirements, is proposed to be changed to amend the continuing education requirements for renewal of a massage therapy license.
- 2. 12 AAC 79.910. "Moral turpitude" defined, is proposed to be changed to further define a crime involving moral turpitude.
- 3. **12 AAC 79.990, Definitions,** is proposed to include the words "and standard" to "universal precautions".
