Marijuana Control Board update to regulations regarding the effect on licenses of a restriction on the sale of marijuana and marijuana products or the operation of marijuana establishments (3 AAC 306.250)

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Marijuana Control Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a specific delegation dated June 23, 2017 from the regulations attorney. The regulations update provisions to address the effect on licenses of a restriction by a local government on the sale of marijuana and marijuana products or the operation of marijuana establishments.

We find no legal problems with the regulations. Though the attached affidavit of agency record refers to the Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office not receiving public comments, the office serves as support staff to the Marijuana Control Board: the agency that considers public comments and formally keeps the record of public comments if any are received. The certification of adoption order indicates that the board paid special attention to the cost to private persons of the regulations, even though public comments were not received for this project. The informal reference in the affidavit to the board's support staff is not a substantive violation of the Administrative Procedure Act. Also, though the title of the certification of adoption order reads "Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office", the substantive body of the order plainly states that the adopting body is the Marijuana Control Board, as do the accompanying affidavit of board action and informal minutes. The clerical error in the title of the certification of adoption order is not a substantive violation order action and informal minutes. The clerical error in the title of the certification of adoption order is not a substantive violation of the Administrative Procedure Act.

This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The February 28, 2017 public notice and the May 3, 2017 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.
