- (a) Each vessel or facility must be specifically covered by an approved form of financial responsibility. The dollar amounts of required financial responsibility set out in AS 46.04.040 or 46.04.055 are adjusted, based upon the percentage change between the reference base index and the semi-annual average Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers in the Anchorage metropolitan area for the second half of 2016 [2013], as reported by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. An applicant under 18 AAC 75.205 or 18 AAC 75.225 must demonstrate financial responsibility to respond in damages for claims covered by AS 46.04.040(i) in the following applicable minimum amount:
  - (1) for a crude oil terminal facility, \$93,550,000 [\$91,500,000] per incident;
- (2) for a noncrude oil terminal facility, \$46.78 [\$45.75], per incident, for each barrel of total noncrude oil storage capacity at the terminal, or \$1,871,000 [\$1,830,000], whichever is greater, subject to a maximum of \$93,550,000 [\$91,500,000]; if the facility stores more noncrude oil than crude oil, the \$46.78 [\$45.75] per incident, per barrel requirement of this paragraph applies to each barrel of oil storage capacity at the facility;
- (3) for a tank vessel or barge carrying crude oil, \$561.30 [\$549.00], per incident, for each barrel of storage capacity or \$187,100,000 [\$183,000,000] whichever is greater;
- (4) for a tank vessel or barge carrying noncrude oil, \$187.10 [\$183.00], per incident, for each barrel of storage capacity or \$1,871,000 [\$1,830,000], whichever is greater, subject to a maximum of \$65,485,000 [\$64,050,000];
- (5) for a nontank vessel carrying predominantly nonpersistent product, \$187.10 [\$183.00] per incident, for each barrel of total oil storage capacity, persistent and nonpersistent product, on the vessel or \$1,871,000 [\$1,830,000], whichever is greater;

- (6) for a nontank vessel carrying predominantly persistent product, \$561.30 [\$549.00] per incident, for each barrel of total oil storage capacity, persistent product and nonpersistent product, on the vessel or \$9,355,000 [\$9,150,000], whichever is greater;
  - (7) for a railroad tank car,
  - (A) <u>\$561.30</u> [\$549.00] per incident for each barrel of persistent product based on the maximum amount of persistent product storage capacity of any train on the railroad; and
  - (B) \$187.10 [\$183.00] per incident for each barrel of nonpersistent product based on the maximum amount of nonpersistent product storage capacity of any train on the railroad or \$1.871,000 [\$1,830,000], whichever is greater;
    - (8) for a pipeline, \$93,550,000 [\$91,500,000] per incident;
- (9) for an offshore exploration or production facility, \$93,550,000 [\$91,500,000] per incident;
- (10) for an onshore production facility that produces more than 10,000 barrels per day of oil, \$37,420,000 [\$36,600,000] per incident;
- (11) for an onshore production facility that produces more than 5,000, but not more than 10,000 barrels per day of oil, \$18,710,000 [\$18,300,000] per incident;
- (12) for an onshore production facility that produces more than 2,500, but not more than 5,000 barrels per day of oil, \$9,355,000 [\$9,150,000] per incident;
- (13) for an onshore production facility that produces 2,500 or fewer barrels per day of oil, \$1,871,000 [\$1,830,000] per incident;

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. We find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. These regulations are to have an effective date of October 1, 2017; that date will need to be reflected in the history not following each section.

The regulations were adopted by the Department of Environmental Conservation after the close of the public comment period. The regulations concern the dollar amount required for proof of financial responsibility (as adjusted by the Anchorage Consumer Price Index) that must be provided to the department by persons who operate certain oil facilities and vessels.

The April 21, 2017 public notice and the June 14, 2017, adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required. We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

# OIL SPILL FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY: NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE REGULATIONS OF ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION (DEC)

### BRIEF DESCRIPTION

DEC proposes to amend the regulations for proof of financial responsibility that must be provided to DEC by persons who operate certain oil facilities and vessels. AS 46.04.045 requires the dollar amounts to be reviewed and adjusted every three years.

DEC proposes to adopt regulation changes at 18 AAC 75.235 and 18 AAC 75.270 to adjust the dollar amounts of proof of financial responsibility in accordance with changes to the Anchorage Consumer Price Index (CPI). The Anchorage CPI for the second half of 2016 was published January 2017, and these increased dollar amounts correspond with the updated Anchorage CPI.
