We have reviewed the attached regulations from the State Board of Education and Early Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a specific delegation dated August 17, 2017 from the Regulations Attorney. The regulations update and streamline the standards for approval of pre-elementary schools subject to agency jurisdiction under AS 14.07.020(a)(8), including the repeal of provisions regarding private pre-elementary schools outside the agency's minimum jurisdiction and the repeal of former 4 AAC 60.035 (background checks and health and safety standards).

We find no legal problems with the regulations, except for proposed 4 AAC 60.039(c). This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the rest of the attached regulations.

We have disapproved proposed 4 AAC 60.039(c), part of a new section of regulations. As proposed, that subsection read:

(c) The department may require health and safety inspections based on complaints or other information received regarding health and safety concerns. After a finding of deficiency is reported on an inspection report, the school district or Head Start agency [that operates the pre-elementary school] shall prepare a written corrective action plan to address the deficiency.

But the State Board of Education and Early Development no longer has its own health and safety standards, because in this project the board repealed 4 AAC 60.035 (background checks and health and safety standards) altogether. Of course, a pre-elementary school indeed may have a health or safety issue--for example, a building code or food safety code violation-but an agency other than the Department of Education and Early Development would address the matter. If a pre-elementary school were required to submit to a *department* inspection, neither the pre-elementary school nor the inspector would know what health or safety standards the board

expects the school to comply with, or how to bring the school into compliance. The closest thing to a standard is the phrase "complaints or other information [about] health and safety concerns."

The Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62) reduces the risk that an agency might apply regulations in an arbitrary manner. To require inspections and corrective action plans without corresponding standards would expose the state to litigation as to whether a department action was arbitrary. Accordingly, we have disapproved proposed 4 AAC 60.039(c).

The April 12, 2017 public notice and the June 21, 2017 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

Please note that the first sentence of new 4 AAC 60.037 (transition) contains a placeholder for a date that is timed to the effective date of the regulations. Once the regulations are filed and the effective date thus established under AS 44.62.180, we request that your office make handwritten edits to substitute the correct date for the placeholder text.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.


