ORDER ADOPTING CHANGES TO REGULATIONS
OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES


The attached 13 pages of regulations, dealing with use and management of the Knik River Public Use Area, uses requiring a permit, new prohibitions within the area that could result in fines, user fees, and minor technical corrections, are adopted and certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Department of Natural Resources adopts under the authority of AS 38.05.020 and AS 41.23 and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

In considering public comments, the Department of Natural Resources paid special attention to the cost to private persons of the regulatory action being taken.

The regulation changes adopted under this order take effect on the 30th day after they have been filed by the lieutenant governor, as provided in AS 44.62.180.

(ii) application for a revocable commercial use or occupancy permit, \$100;

(iii) application for a revocable non-commercial organized group use or occupancy permit, \$100;

(iv) personal use or occupancy permit, each person, each calendar day, \$25;

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(v) personal use or occupancy permit pass, each person, each calendar year, \$250;

(vi) personal use or occupancy permit, each non-commercial organized group, each calendar day, \$250;

(vii) commercial use or occupancy permit, each calendar day, \$500;

(viii) state, federal or local agency use or occupancy permit, each calendar day, \$250.

(5) a permit or other written authorization is required for the use or occupancy of the *Kenny and Patti Barber Shooting Range*, as depicted on the map entitled *Kenny and Patti Barber Shooting Range*, dated May 18, 2016, and adopted by reference; within the *Kenny and Patti Barber Shooting Range*

(A) the rules and conditions for use of the shooting range include the rules

for the protection and safety of the general public and to further the purposes for which the shooting range was established, which are specified in 11 AAC 96.016(c)(20) and shall be conspicuously posted at the shooting range and upon the division of mining, land and water's public webpage on the department's website;

(B) the department may deny a permit or revoke a person's permit to use, occupy, or access the shooting range upon failure to comply with rules or conditions for use; the rules and conditions for use that are posted at the shooting range and on the division of mining, land and water's public webpage may include restrictions on firearm use or ammunition type, magazine capacity, and other conditions as the department considers advisable;

(C) the use of the shooting range for commercial purposes or by organized group in excess of 50 individuals requires a commercial use permit under 11 AAC 96.010;

(D) the department may restrict permits for the commercial use of the shooting range if the department finds that

(i) there is a need to limit the number or use of commercial use permits to protect public use of the shooting area, or to protect shooting area resources;

(ii) there is a need to prevent one business or person from monopolizing commercial activities within the shooting range or portion of the shooting range;

(iii) without limitation of the number of permits or use of the

shooting range there would likely be a degradation of quality of the recreational experience in the shooting range; or

(iv) the demand for the commercial use of the shooting range exceeds the capacity of the shooting range;

(E) the term of a commercial use permit issued under this paragraph may not exceed 30 consecutive days, and is revocable at will by the department; the department may limit the number of competitive commercial use permits a person may hold; a permit may not be assigned without the written consent of the department;

(F) the department may restrict personal use permits for the use of the shooting range if the department finds that

(i) there is a need to limit the number or use of permits to protect public use of the shooting area, or to protect shooting area resources;

(ii) there is a need to prevent one business or person from monopolizing activities within the shooting range or portion of the shooting range;

(iii) without limitation of the number of permits or use of the shooting range there would likely be a degradation of quality of the recreational experience in the shooting range; or

(iv) the demand for the use of the shooting range exceeds the capacity of the shooting range; and

(G) the term of a personal use permit issued under this paragraph may not exceed the calendar year, and is revocable at will by the department; the department may

limit the number of personal use or occupancy permits a person may hold; a permit may not be assigned without the written consent of the department.

- (vii) the person may engage in shooting only during open shooting times from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. daily except the shooting range is closed to all shooting every Wednesday and may be closed to all shooting on other days or times designated by the department and conspicuously posted at the shooting range;

(viii) the person may not use or be under the influence of alcohol, marijuana, or drugs that result in physical or mental conduct that is impaired, or result in the exhibition of those plain and easily observed or discovered outward manifestations of behavior commonly known to be produced by the consumption of alcoholic beverages, marijuana, or drugs that impair physical or mental conduct;

(ix) the person may not use or occupy the shooting range if the department has revoked or suspended the person's access to the shooting range;

(x) the person shall comply with shooting range rules conspicuously posted at the shooting range or upon the division of mining, land and water's public webpage on the department's website; and

(xi) the person may not have an open bottle, can, or other receptacle containing an alcoholic beverage, as defined in AS 28.35.029(c), when within the shooting range.

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Department of Natural Resources against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Please see attached public notice regarding the Department of Natural Resources' proposed regulations for the Knik River Public Use Area.

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE
REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES**

The Department of Natural Resources proposes to adopt and amend regulations in Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with land use authorization fees, and the allowed and prohibited land uses and activities within the Knik River Public Use Area, include the following:

- 1) 11 AAC 05.010(e) is proposed to be amended to provide for user fees for the public shooting range recently constructed within the Knik River Public Use Area, and to make technical corrections to the department's fee regulations.
- 2) 11 AAC 96.016(b) is proposed to be amended to establish the public shooting range within the Knik River Public Use Area. The proposed regulations establish management standards for the shooting area which would apply to users of the public shooting range and facilitate the management of this public facility.

- 3) 11 AAC 96.016(c) is proposed to be amended to further define existing prohibited activities and land uses within the Knik River Public Use Area that may be subject to citations and for fines as have been set by the Supreme Court of the State of Alaska.
- 4) 11 AAC 96.016(c) is proposed to be amended to establish additional prohibited uses and activities within the Knik River Public Use Area that may be subject to citations and for fines as will be set by the Supreme Court of the State of Alaska, including activities and land uses
 - within the public shooting range established within the Knik River Public Use Area
 - on specified trails; and
 - within and near identified public use sites.

The proposed regulation changes are necessary to meet the statutory requirements of AS 43.23.180-230 to perpetuate, enhance, protect, and maintain the resources, access, habitat, fish and wildlife, and public recreational opportunities of the Knik River Public Use Area. The law allows the Commissioner to establish in regulations the means by which the department may manage and enforce public land use restrictions in the public use area.



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
