

OF THE COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION


The attached 4 pages of regulations, dealing with updating the references to the federal guidelines used to determine eligibility for reduced permit fees, are adopted and certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission adopts under the authority of AS 16.43.110 and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

Although no public comments were received, the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission paid special attention to the cost to private persons of the regulatory action being taken.

The regulation changes adopted under this order take effect on the 30th day after they have been filed by the lieutenant governor, as provided in AS 44.62.180.



(c) A resident of this state may apply for a reduced fee for the issuance of an interim-use permit or the annual renewal of an interim-use or entry permit if the resident's total family income, as defined for the food stamp program in 7 C.F.R. 273.9 – 273.11, as revised as of January 1, 2017 [2016] and adopted by reference, falls within the poverty guidelines published by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, in the Federal Register on January 31, 2017 [JANUARY 25, 2016] and adopted by reference, and the resident's assets and resources do not exceed those established for the food stamp program in 7 C.F.R. 273.8, as revised as of January 1, 2017 [2016] and adopted by reference. The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. The regulations update eligibility standards to qualify for reduced permit fees; the updated 2017 poverty guidelines for the 48 contiguous states were available for review during the comment period. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The regulations were adopted by the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission after the close of the public comment period. The August 3, 2017 public notice and the certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION
The Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission proposes to change regulations regarding reduced permit renewal fees.

The Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 20, Chapter 05 of the Alaska Administrative Code dealing with annual fees, including the following:

20 AAC 05.245(c)-(e), 20 AAC 05.250(b), and 20 AAC 05.1910(h) are proposed to be changed by updating the references to the federal guidelines used to determine eligibility for reduced permit fees.

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to Randy Lippert at Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, 8800 Glacier Highway, Suite 109, P.O.
