The attached one page of regulations, dealing with occupational licensing fees for naturopaths, is adopted and certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development adopts under the authority of AS 08.01.065, AS 08.45.020, AS 08.45.030, AS 08.45.035, and AS 08.45.100 and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING FEES FOR  
NATUROPATHS IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE,  
COMMUNITY, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION:** The Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development proposes to change occupational license fees charged to naturopaths.

The Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development (Department) proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 12, Chapter 02 of the Alaska Administrative Code including the following:

**12 AAC 02.270. Naturopaths**, is proposed to be changed to alter the license and renewal fees for naturopaths.

Under AS 08.01.065, the Department must establish fee levels so that the total amount of fees collected for an occupation approximately equals the actual regulatory costs for the occupation. The Department has reviewed the income and expenses for the occupational licensing program for the Naturopathy and proposes fee changes that reflect, to the extent possible, the actual costs of the activities related to the program.

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to Jun Maiquis, Regulations Specialist, Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing, P.O. Box 110806, Juneau, AK 99811-0806. Comments may also be submitted through the Alaska Online Public Notice System by accessing this notice on the system at <http://notice.alaska.gov/188297>, and using the comment link. **The comments must be received not later than 5:00 p.m. on February 5, 2018.** Comments received after this deadline will not be considered by the Department.

The Department may, but is not required to, answer written questions received after the 10-day cut-off date and before the end of the comment period.


