The attached thirty-three (33) pages of regulations, dealing with 13 AAC 85.050 - 89.040, regarding basic standards for instructor, academy, and course certification and updating to reflect recent statutory mandates are certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Alaska Police Standards Council adopted at its December 5, 2017, meeting, under the authority of AS 18.65.220, AS 18.65.240, and AS 18.65.270 and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

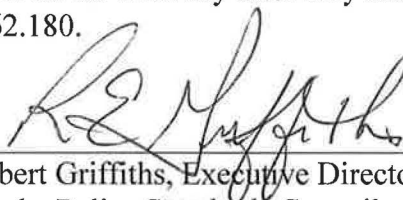
This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Alaska Police Standards Council proposes to adopt regulation changes in the Title 13 of the Alaska Administrative Code dealing with the basic standards for instructor, academy, and course certification and updating to reflect recent statutory mandates.

Pursuant to the authority in AS 18.65.220 (1) & (2), the Alaska Police Standards Council proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 13 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the consolidation of training program certification and training instructor certification programs; implementation of training mandated by the legislature, inclusion of pretrial services officers in the definition of probation officers, and minor administrative corrections, including the following:

- (1) 13 AAC 85.050 and 060, 13 AAC 87.060, 13 AAC 87.080, and 13 AAC 89.040 are proposed to be changed to include disability awareness training for police, corrections, probation/parole, municipal corrections, and village police officers in compliance with changes in AS 18.65.220 made by the legislature in *Chapter 8 SLA 17*
- (2) 13 AAC 85.900 is proposed to be changed to include pretrial services officers in the regulatory definition of probation officers, mandated by legislative enactment of AS 33.07 in *Chapter 36, SLA 2016*
- (3) 13 AAC 87.010 and 020 are proposed to be changed to reconcile and consolidate police, corrections, municipal corrections probation and parole officer training program certification into one program certification for law enforcement training; this allows the repeal of 13 AAC 87.050 and 13 AAC 87.075.
- (4) 13 AAC 85.230 and 235 are proposed to be changed to conform to new language mandated by changes made in item (3).
- (5) 13 AAC 87.040 is proposed to be changed to reconcile and consolidate police, corrections probation and parole, and general instructor certification programs into one "Law Enforcement Instructor" certification program, allowing the repeal of 13 AAC 87.070 and 13 AAC 87.085.

Pursuant to the authority in AS 18.65.220 (1) & (2), the Alaska Police Standards Council proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 13 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the consolidation of training program certification and training instructor certification programs; implementation of training mandated by the legislature, inclusion of pretrial services officers in the definition of probation officers, and minor administrative corrections, including the following:

- (1) 13 AAC 85.050 and 060, 13 AAC 87.060, 13 AAC 87.080, and 13 AAC 89.040 are proposed to be changed to include disability awareness training for police, corrections, probation/parole, municipal corrections, and village police officers in compliance with changes in AS 18.65.220 made by the legislature in Chapter 8 SLA 17
- (2) 13 AAC 85.900 is proposed to be changed to include pretrial services officers in the regulatory definition of probation officers, mandated by legislative enactment of AS 33.07 in Chapter 36, SLA 2016
- (3) 13 AAC 87.010 and 020 are proposed to be changed to reconcile and consolidate police, corrections, municipal corrections probation and parole officer training program certification into one program certification for law enforcement training; this allows the repeal of 13 AAC 87.050 and 13 AAC 87.075.
- (4) 13 AAC 85.230 and 235 are proposed to be changed to conform to new language mandated by changes made in item (3).
- (5) 13 AAC 87.040 is proposed to be changed to reconcile and consolidate police, corrections probation and parole, and general instructor certification programs into one "Law Enforcement Instructor" certification program, allowing the repeal of 13 AAC 87.070 and 13 AAC 87.085.

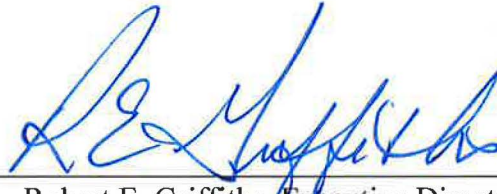

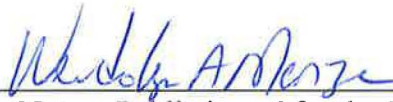

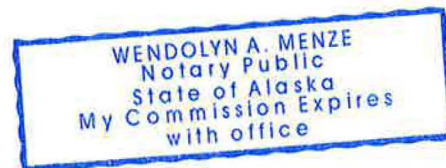
