The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Labor and Workforce Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The regulations were adopted after the close of the public comment period. The regulations concern the determination of an employing unit for a motion picture project worker employed by a motion picture project employer.

The December 31, 2017 public notice and the February 15, 2018 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Department of Labor and Workforce Development proposes to change regulations on unemployment insurance to include a new regulation defining 'a motion picture project employer (MPPE) as an employer for the purpose of paying unemployment tax' and amending a current regulation to limit a backdate request from agent states to one year.

The Department of Labor and Workforce Development proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 8 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with unemployment insurance, including the following:

- (1) 8 AAC 85 is proposed to be changed as follows:
 - AAC 85.016 Addition of a new regulation defining a motion picture project employer an employing entity.
 - AAC 85.110 is amended by adding a new subsection to limit the backdating request from an agent state to one year.




