ORDER CERTIFYING THE CHANGES TO REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF NURSING

The attached forty-seven pages of regulations, relating to licensing and practice of nursing, including advanced practice registered nurse, education, criteria for evaluation of nurse practitioner programs, licensure requirements, license renewal, lapsed license, reinstatement, continuing competency requirements, criminal justice information, temporary permits, review of applications, advanced practice registered nurse role and population foci, certified registered nurse anesthetists, prescriptive authority, controlled substance prescriptive and dispensing authority and standards, preceptorships, identification, unprofessional conduct, certified nurse aide certification requirements, certification renewal, lapsed certification, and definitions, are hereby certified to be a correct copy of the regulation changes that the Board of Nursing adopted at its November 1-3, 2017 meeting, under the authority of AS 08.01.062, AS 08.01.075, AS 08.01.100, and AS 08.68 and after compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62), specifically including notice under AS 44.62.190 and 44.62.200 and opportunity for public comment under AS 44.62.210.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

On the record, in considering public comments, the Board of Nursing paid special attention to the cost to private persons of the regulatory action being taken.

The regulation changes described in this order take effect on the 30th day after they have been filed by the lieutenant governor, as provided in AS 44.62.180.

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Board of Nursing against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a specific delegation of authority dated April 13, 2018 from the Regulations Attorney. The regulations are a general update, including updates to application, licensure, and practice requirements for registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, advanced practice registered nurses, and certified nurse aides. The regulations also replace the outdated term "advanced nurse practitioner" with the current term "advanced practice registered nurse" and repeal provisions that treated certified registered nurse anesthetists as separate from other advanced practice nurse practitioners.

We have received confirmation from agency staff to defer our review of a number of regulations to a Part 2 of this project or to a separate regulations project, pending additional board work on those provisions. The language for which we have deferred review, and that is marked as "withdrawn" on the attached regulations, is as follows:

We also note that the Board of Nursing, at its meeting of November 1, 2017, withdrew what had originally been proposed as 12 AAC 44.770(35). We have displayed the Board's withdrawal of the proposed paragraph and renumbered the following paragraphs accordingly.

We find no legal problems with Part 1 of the regulations. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

Please note that 12 AAC 44.380(c) [page 10] and 12 AAC 44.445(h) [page 22] contain placeholders for dates that are timed to the effective date of the regulations. Once the regulations are filed and the effective date thus established under AS 44.62.180, we request that your office make handwritten edits to substitute the correct date for the placeholder text. Though the placeholders are structured "__/___", please fill in the date using the name of the month, the day followed by a comma, and the year; for example, if the regulations are filed April 19, 2018, please set out the effective date as "May 19, 2018" rather than "5/19/2018".

The addition of a definition to 12 AAC 44.990 for the abbreviation "CNA" [page 47] is technical: it simply spells out the abbreviation, to reflect the Board of Nursing's use of the abbreviation for the first time elsewhere in the attached regulations.

The July 18, 2017 public notice and the November 29, 2017 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES RELATING TO THE LICENSING AND PRACTICE OF NURSING IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF NURSING

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The Board of Nursing proposes to update regulations relating to licensing and practice of nursing.

The Board of Nursing (Board) proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 12, Chapter 44, of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with all aspects of the licensing and practice of nursing under the authority of the Board of Nursing AS 08.68 and 12 AAC 44. The proposed regulations deal with a wide range of subjects, including changing the title from "ANP" to "APRN" or "advanced nurse practitioner" to "advanced practice registered nurse" throughout Chapter 44, as well as education, criteria for evaluation of nurse practitioner programs, licensure requirements, license renewal, lapsed license, reinstatement, continuing education requirements, criminal justice information, temporary permits, review of applications, advanced practice registered nurse role and population focus, scope of practice, prescriptive authority, controlled substance prescriptive and dispensing authority and standards, preceptorships, identification, unprofessional conduct, CNA certification requirements, certification renewal, lapsed certification, and definitions.




