Marijuana Control Board regulations re: quality control samples and reporting theft and similar activities on licensed premises (3 AAC 306.460(d); 3 AAC 306.557; 3 AAC 306.715(e))

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Marijuana Control Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a specific delegation dated April 23, 2018 from the regulations attorney. The regulations establish procedures and requirements for a marijuana cultivation facility or a marijuana product manufacturing facility to provide to an employee of the facility, for purposes of quality control, a sample of the marijuana cultivated or of the concentrate or other marijuana product produced. The regulations also establish requirements for reporting--to the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development, Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office--possible theft or similar activities on the licensed premises of a marijuana establishment.

We find no legal problems with the regulations. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The August 20, 2017 public notice and the February 13, 2018 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
