4 AAC 12 is amended by adding a new section to read:

4 AAC 12.388. World language expert limited teacher certificate. (a) The department will issue a limited world language certificate (Type W limited) with an endorsement in the world language of expertise if the commissioner determines that

(1) the applicant has demonstrated world language expertise and has the educational background described in (b) or (e) of this section;

(2) the school board for the district in which the applicant will be employed, through its superintendent, has requested issuance of a world language limited teacher certificate for the applicant under this section;

(3) the school board for the district in which the applicant will be employed provides an experienced mentor for at least the first two years of the applicant's employment with the school district; the mentor must hold or have held the position of a world language teacher in a school district in this state under a valid certificate;

(4) the applicant has successfully passed the criminal history background check in the same manner as a teacher certified under AS 14.20.020 and 4 AAC 12.300;

(5) the applicant submits to the department

(A) one completed fingerprint card, with fingerprinting performed by a law enforcement agency or a person who has been trained in recording fingerprints, for separate submittal to the Department of Public

requirements within two years after receipt of a world language expert limited initial teacher certificate under this section; or have completed an approved teacher education program at a regionally accredited institution.

(c) The department may extend the one-year limited world language certificate issued under (b) of this section for an additional year, if the applicant demonstrates that the applicant shows substantial progress toward completion of the teacher education preparation program described in (b) of this section.

(d) The department may approve an additional one-year extension of the extended certificate issued under (c) of this section, if the applicant has completed three semester hours of Alaska studies and three semester hours in multicultural education or cross-cultural communications as described in AS 14.20.020(h) and the teacher education preparation program described in (b) of this section.

(e) To demonstrate the competency required under (a) of this section for a five year renewable certificate, the applicant must

(1) hold at least a baccalaureate degree from an institution of higher education accredited by a recognized regional accrediting association;

(2) have met or exceeded the required scores on the associate world language content examination, as described in 4 AAC 12.407 and met or exceeded the required scores on the mathematics math subtest of one of the competency examination required under 4 AAC 12.310; and

(3) have completed an approved teacher education program at a regionally accredited institution;

(4) have completed three semester hours of Alaska studies and three semester hours in multicultural education or cross-cultural communications as described in AS 14.20.020(h); and

(5) have two years of employment as a teacher while holding a valid teaching certificate issued by a state; and

(6) have earned at least six semester hours of college credit within the five years immediately preceding application.

(f) A public school district shall only employ a world language expert teacher to teach in which subject areas the individual has earned endorsements, as described in 4 AAC 12.395 and 4 AAC 12.396, or in the subject area of the teacher preparation program in which the teacher is enrolled. A world language expert teacher may only provide instruction in the language of expertise.

(g) Except for a certificate issued under (e) of this section, the department will not issue to an applicant more than once a certificate or extension of a certificate available under this section.

(h) The department will ~~shall~~ renew the world language limited certificate issued under (e) of this section if the applicant satisfies the requirements described in 4 AAC 12.405.

(i) In this section, "world language expert teacher" is an individual who holds a valid world language limited teacher certificate.

(j) In this section, "world language" means any language, excluding the English language, that can be tested by an appropriate content area examination listed or referenced under 4 AAC 12.407. (Eff. 6/29/2018, Register 226)

We have reviewed the attached regulations from the State Board of Education and Early Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. I have reviewed this project under a general delegation dated May 23, 2018 from the Regulations Attorney. The regulations establish requirements and procedures for obtaining a world language expert limited teacher certificate.

We find no legal problems with the regulations. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the rest of the attached regulations.

The January 5, 2018 public notice and the May 29, 2018 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The proposed regulation would allow a district to sponsor a limited teacher certificate for world language experts who 1) hold at least a bachelor's degree; 2) pass an approved world language content area exam and the math portion of one of the approved basic competency exam; and 3) are enrolled in or have completed an approved teacher preparation program.

The Department of Education and Early Development proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code dealing with teacher certification, including the following:

4 AAC 12.388, with proposed changes, would amend the list of approved teacher certificates to include a world language expert limited certificate.

The Department of Education and Early Development invites the public to submit written comments during the written comment period, which begins with the date of this notice and ends on February 2, at 4:30 p.m. The written comment period closes in advance of the meeting of the State Board of Education and Early Development at which the board will consider the adoption of the proposed regulations. This allows the Department of Education and Early Development an opportunity to prepare changes based on written comment and to distribute any proposed changes to the board for its consideration prior to the meeting.

If a question is relevant to the proposed change in the regulations and the question is received by January 23, which is ten days before the end of the public comment period, the department will make a good-faith effort to answer the question before the end of the public comment period. The Department of Education and Early Development will aggregate its response to substantially similar questions and make the questions and responses available on the Alaska Online Public Notice System and on the website of the Department of Education and Early Development at <https://education.alaska.gov/regs/comment.cfm>

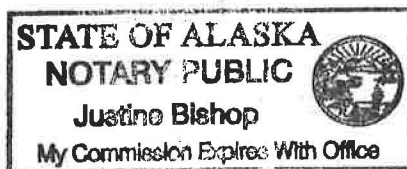
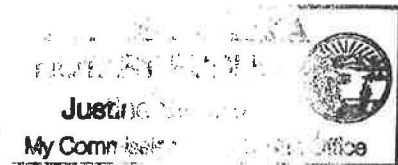
