

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations concern fees for acupuncturist biennial license renewal.

The regulations were adopted by the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development after the close of the public comment period. The May 14, 2018 public notice and the adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made a minor technical correction to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125.


