We have reviewed the attached Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development changes to these regulations against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. The regulations concern record retention requirements, reporting loan limits, and borrowing. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development after the close of the public comment period.
