The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. I have reviewed this project under a general delegation dated December 5, 2014 from the Regulations Attorney. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development after the close of the public comment period. The regulations adjust fees for concert promoters, a profession regulated directly by the the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development.

The August 7, 2018 public notice and the September 17, 2018 adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

Please note that the agency has requested that these regulations be filed not later than September 24, 2018, to achieve a target effective date not later than October 24, 2018.


