(a) If a sample tested by a marijuana testing facility does not pass the required tests based including a visual foreign matter inspection,) on the standards set out in 3 AAC 306.645, the marijuana establishment that provided the sample shall

(1) dispose of the entire harvest batch or production lot from which the sample was taken in accordance with 3 AAC 306.740 and

- (2) document the disposal of the sample using the marijuana establishment's marijuana inventory tracking system.
- (b) If a sample of marijuana fails a required test, any marijuana plant trim, leaf, and other usable material from the same plants automatically fail the required test. The board or director may approve a <u>written</u> request, on a form prescribed by the board, to allow a batch of marijuana that fails a required test to be used to make a carbon dioxide- or solvent-based extract. - (2) non-compostable materials including paper waste, cardboard waste, plastic waste, oil, or other wastes approved by the board when the mixed material may be delivered to a permitted solid waste facility, incinerator, or other facility with approval of any applicable local government entity.
- (e) If marijuana or a marijuana product is found by, or surrendered to, a law enforcement officer including a peace officer or an airport security officer, the officer may dispose of the marijuana or marijuana product as provided in this section or by any method that is allowed under any applicable local ordinance. The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Marijuana Control Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. I have reviewed this project under a general delegation dated December 5, 2014 from the Regulations Attorney. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Marijuana Control Board after the close of the public comment period. The regulations clarify how a licensee may request a retest for marijuana or a marijuana product that failed a required test, how a licensee may request that failed materials be used to make extract, and how a licensee is to dispose of batches and production lots from which samples have failed.

The May 3, 2018 public notice and the September 10, 2018 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
