We have reviewed the attached regulations from the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board and the Department of Labor and Workforce Development against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. The regulations update the requirements regarding fees for medical treatment of and medical services to injured employees.

We find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. We note that the Department of Labor and Workforce Development adoption order and the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board certification of adoption order both set a *special effective date of January 1, 2019* for these regulations.

The August 20, 2018 public notice, the October 11, 2018 certification of adoption order from the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board, and the October 12, 2018 adoption order from the Department of Labor and Workforce Development all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
