

Alaska Birth Defect Registry Reporting Guide

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Introduction

The Alaska Birth Defects Registry (ABDR) was established in 1996 under Alaska Regulation 7 AAC 27.012. Health care providers, hospitals, other health care facilities, regional health exchanges, and third party payers report to ABDR when they have cared for, collect or maintain a record of service to a child under the age of three, with any of the congenital conditions listed below.

ABDR provides information on the occurrence and distribution of congenital birth defects within the State of Alaska.

Authority

Please refer to the enabling regulation above and the references cited in the included Commissioners Letter (p.5) which addresses data collection for public health use.

Reporting

Who: Any organization that provides service to or collects, and maintains records of service to children under the age of three with any of the conditions listed below.

When: Report all conditions within three months of the date of service. The registry would recommend agencies experiencing a high volume of reportable condition encounters to report monthly. Agencies that see individuals with reportable conditions infrequently should report by exception (only when you have activity to report).

What: Please include data for:

- All of the divisions and / or business segments of your organization.
 - In-patient, outpatient, admits, discharges, radiology, laboratory, specialty clinics, etc.
- All individuals seen by your organization up until their 3rd birthday. (Date of Service – Date of Birth) <3
- All of the ICD-10 CM codes listed in the following tables.

Dear Colleague:

The Alaska Division of Public Health, an agency of the State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services, is conducting activities in its capacity as a public health authority as defined by both Alaska Statute (AS § 18.15.355 - 18.15.395) and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, Standards for Privacy of Individual and Identifiable Health Information, Final Rule (Privacy Rule) [45 CFR § 164.501].

Pursuant to 45 CFR § 164.512(b) of the Privacy Rule, covered entities such as your organization may disclose, without individual authorization, protected health information to public health authorities "...authorized by law to collect or receive such information for the purpose of preventing or controlling disease, injury, or disability, including, but not limited to, the reporting of disease, injury, vital events such as birth or death, and the conduct of public health surveillance, public health investigations, and public health interventions...". Authorization and power to "obtain information from federal, state, and local governmental agencies, Alaska Native organizations, health care providers..., or other private and public organizations operating in the state..." is outlined in AS § 18.15.360(b) with information and security safeguards established in AS § 18.15.365.

In the Alaska Division of Public Health/Section of Women's, Children's and Family Health is undertaking public health activities as described by 45 CFR § 164.512(b) and authorized by Alaska statute and regulation (AS § 18.05.010). The information being requested represents the minimum necessary to carry out the public health purposes of this project which is to conduct statewide surveillance or epidemiologic investigations as related to Maternal and Child Health issues pursuant to 45 CFR § 164.512(b) of the Privacy Rule and AS § 18.15.362.
