You must submit an annual to your Regional Migratory Bird Permit Office report each year, even if you had no activity.

Authorizations and Conditions:

- A. General conditions set out in Subpart B of 50 CFR 13, and specific conditions contained in Federal regulations cited above, are hereby made a part of this permit. All activities authorized herein must be carried out in accord with and for the purposes described in the application submitted. Continued validity, or renewal of this permit is subject to complete and timely compliance with all applicable conditions, including the filing of all required information and reports.
- B. The validity of this permit is also conditioned upon strict observance of all applicable foreign, state, local tribal, or other federal law.
- C. Valid for use by permittee named above.
- D. You must have written authority from the Alaska department of Fish and Game, Juneau, Alaska before exercising any of the authorities granted by this permit.
- E. You are authorized to take, temporarily possess, and transport the migratory birds specified below to relieve or prevent injurious situations impacting public safety. All take must be done as part of an integrated wildlife damage management program that emphasizes nonlethal management techniques. You may not use this authority for situations in which migratory birds are merely causing a nuisance. **Permittee must contact the USFWS Permit Office (907-786-3693) within 48 hours when the total lethal take of any raptor species exceeds three birds.**

(1) The following may be lethally taken: Minimum number and species.

(2) The following may be live-trapped and relocated: Minimum number and species.

(3) The following active nests (including eggs) may be destroyed: Minimum number and species.

F. You are authorized in emergency situations only to take, trap, or relocate any migratory birds, nests and eggs, including species that are not listed in Condition D (except bald eagles, golden eagles, or endangered or threatened species) when the migratory birds, nests, or eggs are posing a direct threat to human safety. A direct threat to human safety is one which involves a threat of serious bodily injury or a risk to human life.



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You must report any emergency take activity to your migratory bird permit issuing office at 907-786-3693 within 72 hours after the emergency take action. Your report must include the species and number of birds taken, method, and a complete description of the circumstances warranting the emergency action.

G. You are authorized to salvage and temporarily possess migratory birds found dead or taken under this permit for (1) disposal, (2) transfer to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, (3) diagnostic purposes, (4) purposes of training airport personnel, (5) donation to a public scientific or educational institution as defined in 50 CFR 10.12, (6) donation to persons authorized by permit or regulation to possess them, or (7) donation of migratory game birds only to a public charity (those suitable for human consumption). Any dead bald eagles or golden eagles salvaged must be reported within 48 hours to the National Eagle Repository at (303) 287-2110 and to the migratory bird permit issuing office at 907-786-3693. The Repository will provide directions for shipment of these specimens.

H. Before you salvage any bird killed by suspected illegal activity, you must first contact to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Office of Law Enforcement (OLE) for authorization to salvage that bird. See FWS OLE contact information below.

I. You may use the following methods of take: (1) firearms; (2) nets; (3) registered animal drugs (excluding nicarbazin), pesticides and repellents; (4) falconry abatement; and (5) legal lethal and live traps (excluding pole traps). Birds caught live may be euthanized or transported and relocated to another site approved by the appropriate State wildlife agency, if required. When using firearms, you may use rifles or air rifles to shoot any bird when you determine that the use of a shotgun is inadequate to resolve the injurious situation. You may use paint ball guns to haze birds or deter birds only when other methods of hazing are ineffective.

Anyone who takes migratory birds under the authority of this permit must follow the American Veterinary Medical Association Guidelines on Euthanasia when euthanasia is necessary (http://www.avma.org/issues/animal_welfare/euthanasia.pdf).

J. You may temporarily possess and stabilize sick and injured migratory birds and immediately transport them to a federally licensed rehabilitator for care.

K. The following subpermittees are authorized: Designated employees of Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson under the direct supervision of Cultural and Natural Resources Chief Brent Koenen and designated employees of USDA Wildlife Services.

In addition, any other person who is (1) employed by or under contract to you for the activities specified in this permit, or (2) otherwise designated a subpermittee by you in writing, may exercise the authority of this permit.

L. You and any subpermittee(s) must comply with the attached Standard Conditions for Migratory Bird Depredation Permits. These standard conditions are a continuation of your permit conditions and must remain with your permit.

Standard Conditions Migratory Bird Depredation Permits 50 CFR 21.41

All of the provisions and conditions of the governing regulations at 50 CFR part 13 and 50 CFR part 21.41 are conditions of your permit. Failure to comply with the conditions of your permit could be cause for suspension of the permit. The standard conditions below are a continuation of your permit conditions and must remain with your permit. If you have questions regarding these conditions, refer to the regulations or, if necessary, contact your migratory bird permit issuing office. For copies of the regulations and forms, or to obtain contact information for your issuing office, visit: <http://www.fws.gov/migratorybirds/mbpermits.html>.

1. To minimize the lethal take of migratory birds, you are required to continually apply non-lethal methods of harassment in conjunction with lethal control.
[Note: Explosive Pest Control Devices (EPCDs) are regulated by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF). If you plan to use EPCDs, you require a Federal explosives permit, unless you are exempt under 27 CFR 555.141. Information and contacts may be found at <http://www.atf.gov/explosives/how-to-become-an-fel.htm>.]
2. Shotguns used to take migratory birds can be no larger than 10-gauge and must be fired from the shoulder. You must use nontoxic shot listed in 50 CFR 20.21(j).
3. You may not use blinds, pits, or other means of concealment, decoys, duck calls, or other devices to lure or entice migratory birds into gun range.
4. You are not authorized to take, capture, harass, or disturb bald eagles or golden eagles, or species listed as threatened or endangered under the Endangered Species Act found in 50 CFR 17, without additional authorization.

For a list of threatened and endangered species in your state, visit the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Threatened and Endangered Species System (TESS) at: <http://www.fws.gov/endangered>.

5. If you encounter a migratory bird with a Federal band issued by the U.S. Geological Survey Bird Banding Laboratory, Laurel, MD, report the band number to 1-800-327-BAND or <http://www.reportband.gov>.
6. This permit does not authorize take or release of any migratory birds, nests, or eggs on Federal lands without additional prior written authorization from the applicable Federal agency, or on State lands or other public or private property without prior written permission or permits from the landowner or custodian.
7. Unless otherwise specified on the face of the permit, migratory birds, nests, or eggs taken under this permit must be:
 - (a) turned over to the U.S. Department of Agriculture for official purposes, or
 - (b) donated to a public educational or scientific institution as defined by 50 CFR 10, or
 - (c) completely destroyed by burial or incineration, or
 - (d) with prior approval from the permit issuing office, donated to persons authorized by permit or regulation to possess them.

8. A subpermittee is an individual to whom you have provided written authorization to conduct some or all of the permitted activities in your absence. Subpermittees must be at least 18 years of age. As the permittee, you are legally responsible for ensuring that your subpermittees are adequately trained and adhere to the terms of your permit. You are responsible for maintaining current records of who you have designated as a subpermittee, including copies of designation letters you have provided.
9. You and any subpermittees must carry a legible copy of this permit, *including these Standard Conditions*, and display it upon request whenever you are exercising its authority.
10. You must maintain records as required in 50 CFR 13.46 and 50 CFR 21.41. All records relating to the permitted activities must be kept at the location indicated in writing by you to the migratory bird permit issuing office.
11. Acceptance of this permit authorizes the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to inspect any wildlife held, and to audit or copy any permits, books, or records required to be kept by the permit and governing regulations.
12. You may not conduct the activities authorized by this permit if doing so would violate the laws of the applicable State, county, municipal or tribal government or any other applicable law.

PUBLIC SAFETY PERMIT

This permit authorizes Brent A. Koenen, U.S. Air Force, Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson
(person, agency or organization)
of 6346 Arctic Warrior Drive, Joint Base Elmendorf-Rich, AK 99506-3240 to conduct the following

activities from January 26, 2018 to January 31, 2019 in accordance with AS 16.05.930.

As provided under 5 AAC 92.033, authority is granted to the permittee and subpermittees to nonlethally haze all birds to alleviate hazards to arriving and departing aircraft at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson (JBER) and at Bryant Airfield. Authority is also granted to take (i.e. kill) migratory birds in the numbers and species authorized by federal permit MB748033 (with amendments) and all birds classified as "deleterious exotic wildlife" (starlings, house sparrows, and pigeons). This permit does not authorize the killing, injuring, or capturing of eagles. Authority is further granted to remove inactive swallow nests and up to ten (10) active cliff swallow and ten (10) violet-green swallow nests which create a health or safety hazard by obstructing building vents, exterior electrical junction boxes, exterior light fixtures, or are located above doors or windows. Every effort shall be made to avoid the destruction of eggs and young. Injured or young birds should be taken to Bird Treatment and Learning Center (907-562-4852). Authority is also granted to remove Canada goose nests and eggs near the airfield, and to remove or relocate Canada goose goslings as specified in federal permit MB748033 (with amendments). All other conditions are the same as the federal permit MB748033 (with amendments).


Authority is granted to nonlethally haze all mammals within one quarter mile of JBER and Bryant Airfield boundaries and to take by lethal means moose, wolves, coyote, red fox, brown bear, black bear, beaver, and porcupine that present a hazard to human safety within the JBER and Bryant Airfield boundaries. **Anchorage Area Biologist Dave Battle (907-267-2185) must approve lethal take of all mammals except deleterious exotic wildlife prior to the animal being killed.** Authority is further granted to take by lethal means all species classified as deleterious exotic wildlife (raccoons, rats, mice, gerbils, other murid rodents, and Belgian hares) on airport property. Authority is granted to capture small and unclassified game and relocate them outside the airfield boundary; porcupines must be relocated the same day they are captured. Final disposition of lethally taken game animals will be directed by the Anchorage DWC staff.

REPORT DUE January 20, 2019. The report shall include the information specified above.

GENERAL CONDITIONS, EXCEPTIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

1. This permit must be carried by person(s) specified during approved activities who shall show it on request to persons authorized to enforce Alaska's fish and game laws. This permit is nontransferable and will be revoked or renewal denied by the Commissioner of Fish and Game if the permittee violates any of its conditions, exceptions or restrictions. No redelegation of authority may be allowed under this permit unless specifically noted.
2. No specimens taken under authority hereof may be sold or bartered. All specimens must be deposited in a public museum or a public scientific or educational institution unless otherwise stated herein. Subpermittees shall not retain possession of live animals or other specimens.
3. The permittee shall keep records of all activities conducted under authority of this permit, available for inspection at all reasonable hours upon request of any authorized state enforcement officer.
4. Permits will not be renewed until detailed reports, as specified above, have been received by the department.
5. **UNLESS SPECIFICALLY STATED HEREIN, THIS PERMIT DOES NOT AUTHORIZE the exportation of specimens or the taking of specimens in areas otherwise closed to hunting and fishing; without appropriate licenses required by state regulations; during closed seasons; or in any manner, by any means, at any time not permitted by those regulations.**

Authority is granted to lethally trap up to three hundred (300) small mammals (squirrels and microtines,) within the airfield boundaries or inside of JBER and Bryant Airfield buildings. Authority is further granted to lethally trap voles and shrews found inside Child Care Centers or found outside the buildings on Child Care Center property. Small mammals taken must be turned over to either the Elmendorf AFB museum or the University of Alaska Museum.

Birds lethally taken under this permit with numbered leg bands shall be reported to the National Bird Banding Lab (BBL). If the permittee or subpermittees capture birds without BBL bands, but with other markers (non-BBL leg bands, collars, patagial markers, or transmitters/geolocators), the permittee shall report the species, gender (if known), date, and location of the capture by email to ADF&G Permits Section (dfg.dwc.permits@alaska.gov) within 5 days of the capture.

The primary permittee may designate subpermittees to conduct activities authorized by this permit. The primary permittee is responsible for the actions of all subpermittees and for ensuring their compliance with the conditions of this permit. All subpermittees must complete bird control training provided by USDA Wildlife Services prior to conducting activities authorized by this permit. The permittee and all subpermittees must also complete bear hazing training prior to conducting activities authorized by this permit. ADF&G or USDA APHIS Wildlife Services in Palmer (907-745-0871) may be able to provide training. Persons conducting activities authorized by this permit are exempt from Fish & Game licensing requirements of AS 16.05.330.

A report of activities must be submitted electronically on a form provided by the Department to the Permits Section (dfg.dwc.permits@alaska.gov) by the date specified on Page 1 of this permit. The report must include: 1) for birds, a monthly summary (by species) of numbers of birds hazed or killed and the disposition of all carcasses; 2) for nests, the date of removal, species, number of eggs or young in the nest, and the final disposition of the nest, eggs, and young; 3) for mammals, a monthly summary of the species and number of animals hazed or killed, the method of hazing or take, and the final disposition of all carcasses; 4) a complete list of all subpermittees; and 5) for each subpermittee, the course name and date s/he completed the bear hazing training.

A separate written report must be submitted for lethal take of any species not authorized by this permit. The report must include a detailed explanation of the circumstances surrounding the take, the final disposition of the carcass and any edible meat, and a description of the steps that will be taken to avoid similar incidents in the future.

The boundaries of Bryant Airfield, bird exclusion zone, and waterfowl exclusion zone are understood to be those areas as defined on the map submitted to the Permits Section on January 18, 2017.

The airfield is defined as being the fenced area surrounding and including the runway.

E. (50 CFR 22.23) You are authorized to use non-lethal scare devices and scare tactics to move or disperse bald eagles endangering human safety due to high potential of a serious bird strike to aircraft including the use of airhorns, pyrotechnics, vehicle horns, and other visual and audible hazing devices. Pyrotechnics must not be shot directly at bald eagles.

(50 CFR 22.27) You are authorized to remove two inactive bald eagle nests located approximately 1 kilometer south of the Elmendorf Airfield (N61.236389 W-149.811667 and N61.236111 W-149.810556; WGS84) to ensure public health and safety. Potential impacts include the permanent loss of one bald eagle breeding territory.

F. You must comply with all avoidance, minimization, or other mitigation measures prescribed by the permit issuing office, including:

- As authorized under "Condition E" of this permit, continue to harass eagles in order to discourage eagles from re-nesting on airport property.
- Remove any new partially constructed bald eagle nests from airport property to discourage eagles from re-nesting. You must ensure partially

G. You must cooperate with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to determine the fates of displaced eagles by providing USFWS personnel and/or their contractors or partners:

- i. access to airport property for purposes of trapping, marking, and monitoring the nesting pairs or other eagles deemed by the UFWS to be germane to the study (i.e., "control" eagle pairs);
- ii. wildlife interaction and harassment data associated with the Elmendorf Airfield; and
- iii. assistance (as requested and reasonable) with the capture and marking of the disturbed pair to facilitate later identification.

H. You must submit a report of activities conducted under this permit to the migratory bird permit issuing office within 10 days following completion of nest removal or of the expiration of this permit, whichever occurs first. I. During nest removal activity, you are authorized to salvage any eagle carcasses, feathers and parts including nonviable eggs found in or around the nest. All eagle carcasses must be immediately frozen and shipped along with molted feathers and parts within 10 days of salvage to the National Eagle Repository. All eagle carcasses, molted feathers and parts should be shipped overnight shipping and shipped only on Monday - Wednesday. Contact: U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Eagle and Wildlife Repository, 5650 Havana St., Building 128, RMA, Commerce City, Colorado, 80022, (303) 287-2110.

Nonviable eagle eggs must be delivered to the Migratory Bird Management Office of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Contact: Stephen B. Lewis, Migratory Bird Management, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, 3000 Vintage Boulevard, Suite 201, Juneau, Alaska 99801, (907) 780-1163.

J. Nests or parts of nests must be destroyed by burial or incineration or donated to a qualified public educational or scientific institution as defined in 50 CFR 10.12 and approved by the your migratory bird permit issuing office.

K. You may delegate the authority granted in this permit to the following subpermittee(s): Designated employees of Joint Base Elmendorf Richardson under the supervision of Jerry Morrill and designated employees of USDA Wildlife Services. In addition, any other person who is (1) employed by or under contract to you for the activities specified in this permit, or (2) otherwise designated a subpermittee by you in writing.

Any subpermittee who has been delegated this authority may not re-delegate to another individual/business. You must immediately notify the migratory bird permit issuing office in writing of any changes to subpermittee information so this permit can be amended to authorize those individuals/businesses.

L. Subpermittees must be at least 18 years of age. You are responsible for ensuring that your subpermittees are qualified to perform the work and adhere to the terms of your permit. You are also responsible for maintaining current records of designated subpermittees. As the permittee, you are ultimately legally responsible for compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit and that responsibility may not be delegated.

M. You and any subpermittees must carry a legible copy of this permit and display it upon request whenever exercising its authority.

N. This permit does not authorize lethal take or injury of eagles or eggs, nor does it authorize take of the nest in the event an eagle, eagle chick, or egg, occupies the nest in the 10 days prior to nest removal.

O. You shall notify the issuing office at 907-786-3503 or 907-786-3693 within 48 hours regarding any injury or death occurring to any bald eagle during project activities. Any injured bald eagle must be immediately transferred to the nearest rehabilitation center.

P. All of the provisions and conditions of the governing regulations at 50 CFR part 13 and 50 CFR 22.27 are conditions of your permit. Failure to comply with the conditions of your permit could be cause for suspension of the permit and/or citation. For copies of the regulations, visit: www.fws.gov/permits/mbpermits/birdbasics.html.

Q. This permit does not authorize you to conduct activities on Federal, State, Tribal, or other public or private property without additional prior written permits or permission from the agency/landowner.

R. You must maintain records as required in 50 CFR 13.46. All records relating to the permitted activities must be kept at the location indicated in writing by you to the migratory bird permit issuing office.

S. Acceptance of this permit authorizes the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to inspect any wildlife held, and to audit or copy any permits, books or records required to be kept by the permit and governing regulations (50 CFR 13.46).

T. While the permit is valid and for up to 3 years after it expires, you must allow Service personnel, or other qualified persons designated by the Service, access to the bald eagle nest site location at any reasonable hour, and with reasonable notice from the Service, for purposes of monitoring eagles at the site.

U. Permittees and subpermittees operating under this permit may not take or disturb eagles contrary to the laws or regulations of any State, Tribal, or Municipal government, and none of the privileges of this authorization are valid unless the permittee possesses the appropriate State permits, or other authorizations, if required.

V. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is not liable for any damage or injury to person(s), wildlife, or property that occurs as the result of carrying out the

activities associated with this permit.

W. The terms and conditions of this permit that are not specifically prescribed by regulations at 50 CFR parts 10, 13, and 22, should not be construed as precedent and are subject to revision for purposes of any future permit issued under this section.
