1	Is this armed security service in place now? If so, who is the incumbent and how long have they been providing service?	No, and second part of the question is not applicable.
2	Is the client seeking to extend this service and how likely is it that a continuation of this service will be approved beyond 6/30/19?	Currently there is no intention to continue this service under a contract that results from this solicitation. OCS may solicit for security guard services state wide that will result in a new contract beginning 7/1/19 and these two locations will be included in that solicitation.
3	Does the budget of \$201,000 reflect the anticipated cost for this service for the period stated 2/11/19 through 6/30/19, or was this the overall budget for the entire fiscal period?	\$201,000.00 is the estimated budget for the term of the contract.
