(c) The request under (b) of this section for a criminal justice information report does not delay **administrative processing** [CONSIDERATION] of the applicant’s license application.

An application will not be considered complete until the criminal justice information required in (a) of this section is received by the board. If criminal justice information that raises questions about an applicant’s qualifications for licensure is received after a license has been issued to the applicant, the department and the board will take action under AS 08.61 and AS 44.62 as appropriate. 12 AAC 79.900. Code of ethics and standards of practice. The Alaska Board of Massage Therapists Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice, dated **December 2018** [JUNE

In order to maintain a high standard of integrity in the profession and to safeguard the health and welfare of the public, massage therapists licensed in this state shall adhere to the code of ethics.
