The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Marijuana Control Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. I have reviewed this project under a delegation dated December 3, 2018 from the regulations attorney. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Marijuana Control Board after the close of the public comment period. The regulations concern requirements for a marijuana establishment applying to renew a license that is in active and operating status, and expiration of that license if it is not timely renewed. The regulations reduce paperwork requirements for an ownership change if the transferee is making no changes to a marijuana establishment's operating plan or licensed premises. The regulations also allow a licensed marijuana product manufacturing facility to transfer set amounts of marijuana concentrates wholesale not only to another licensed marijuana product manufacturing facility but also to a licensed retail marijuana store.

The September 5, 2018 public notice and the November 13, 2018 certification of adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
