## NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES ON ALCOHOL PERMITS IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board proposes to adopt regulation changes in 3 AAC 304 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with alcohol permits, including the following:

- 3 AAC 304.675 is proposed to be repealed and readopted;
- 3 AAC 304.680 (b) and (d) are proposed to be repealed;
- 3 AAC 304.680 (f) is proposed to define "banquet or dinner event;"
- 3 AAC 304.685 is proposed to be repealed;
- 3 AAC 304.687 is a new section regarding special events permits;
- 3 AAC 304.690 (d) is proposed to lower the non-refundable application fee and (e) and (f) would be repealed;
- 3 AAC 304.697 is proposed to amend regulations for art exhibit permits;
- 3 AAC 304.699 is proposed to amend regulations for wine auction permits;

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to the Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office at 550 West 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Suite 1600, Anchorage AK 99501. Additionally, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board will accept comments by electronic mail at <a href="mailto:amco.regs@alaska.gov">amco.regs@alaska.gov</a>. Comments may also be submitted through the Alaska Online Public Notice System by accessing this notice on the system and using the comment link. The comments must be received not later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, April 12, 2019.

You may submit written questions relevant to the proposed action to the Alcohol and Marjuana Control Office at 550 West 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Suite 1600, Anchorage, AK 99501 or to <a href="mailto:amco.regs@alaska.gov">amco.regs@alaska.gov</a>. The questions must be received at least 10 days before the end of the public comment period. The Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office will aggregate its response to substantially similar questions and make the questions and responses available on the Alaska Online Public Notice System and AMCO website.

Written comments received are public records and are subject to public inspection.
