The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Board of Examiners in Optometry against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Board of Examiners in Optometry after the close of the public comment period. Reflecting amendments to AS 08.72 resulting from enactment of ch. 17, SLA 2017 and ch. 2, SSSLA 2017, the regulations establish requirements and procedures for a licensee regulated by the Board of Examiners in Optometry to prescribe and use a pharmaceutical agent or controlled substance.

This project was split into two parts; the regulatory changes in Part 1 were filed January 22, 2019, and took effect February 21, 2019. With Part 2 of this project we have supplied original supporting paperwork, including an original affidavit of publication for a supplemental public notice. For your files we have also included photocopies of the initial public notice and affidavit of publication for the initial public notice.

The June 26, 2018 initial public notice, the November 21, 2018 supplemental public notice, and the January 24, 2019 certification of adoption order all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
