- (1) the bidder has a valid Alaska business license, or will obtain one prior to award of any contract resulting from this ITB. If the bidder possesses a valid Alaska business license, the license number must be written below or one of the following forms of evidence must be submitted with the bid:
 - a canceled check for the business license fee;
 - a copy of the business license application with a receipt date stamp from the State's business license office;
 - a receipt from the State's business license office for the license fee;
 - a copy of the bidder's valid business license;
 - a sworn notarized affidavit that the bidder has applied and paid for a business license;
- (2) the price(s) submitted was arrived at independently and without collusion and that the bidder is complying with:
 - the laws of the State of Alaska;
 - the applicable portion of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964;
 - the Equal Employment Opportunity Act and the regulations issued thereunder by the State and Federal Government; and



If a bidder fails to comply with (2) of this paragraph, the state may reject the bid, terminate the contract, or consider the contractor in default. Bids must be also submitted under the name as appearing on the bidder's current Alaska business license in order to receive the Alaska Bidder Preference.

STANDARD TERMS & CONDITIONS

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS:

- 1. INVITATION TO BID (ITB) REVIEW: Bidders shall carefully review this ITB for defects and questionable or objectionable material. Bidders' comments concerning defects and questionable or objectionable material in the ITB must be made in writing and received by the purchasing authority at least ten (10) days before the bid opening date. This will allow time for an amendment to be issued if one is required. It will also help prevent the opening of a defective bid, upon which award cannot be made, and the resultant exposure of bidders' prices. Bidders' original comments should be sent to the purchasing authority listed on the front of this ITB.
- 2. BID FORMS: Bidders shall use this and attached forms in submitting bids. A photocopied bid may be submitted.
- 3. SUBMITTING BIDS: Envelopes containing bids must be sealed, marked, and addressed as shown in the example below. Envelopes with ITB numbers annotated on the outside will not be opened until the scheduled date and time.



- 4. **PRICES**: The bidder shall state prices in the units of issue on this ITB. Prices quoted for commodities must be in U.S. funds and include applicable federal duty, brokerage fees, packaging, and transportation cost to the FOB point so that upon transfer of title the commodity can be utilized without further cost. Prices quoted for services must be quoted in U.S. funds and include applicable federal duty, brokerage fee, packaging, and transportation cost so that the services can be provided without further cost. Prices quoted in bids must be exclusive of federal, state, and local taxes. If the bidder believes that certain taxes are payable by the State, the bidder may list such taxes separately, directly below the bid price for the affected item. The State is exempt from Federal Excise Tax except the following:
 - Coal Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (IRC), Section 4121 on the purchase of coal;
 - "Gas Guzzler" IRC, Section 4064 on the purchase of low m.p.g. automobiles, except that police and other emergency type vehicles are not subject to the tax;
 - Air Cargo IRC, Section 4271 on the purchase of property transportation services by air;
 - Air Passenger IRC, Section 4261 on the purchase of passenger transportation services by air carriers.
 - Leaking Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund Tax (LUST) IRC, Section 4081 on the purchase of Aviation gasoline, Diesel Fuel, Gasoline, and Kerosene.
- 5. VENDOR TAX ID NUMBER: If goods or services procured through this ITB are of a type that is required to be included on a Miscellaneous Tax Statement, as described in the Internal Revenue Code, a valid tax identification number must be provided to the State of Alaska before payment will be made.
- 6. FILING A PROTEST: A bidder may protest the award of a contract or the proposed award of a contract for supplies, services, or professional services. The protest must be filed in writing and include the following information: (1) the name, address, and telephone number of the protester; (2) the signature of the protester or the protester's representative; (3) identification of the contracting agency and the solicitation or contract at issue; (4) a detailed statement of the legal and factual grounds of the protest, including copies of relevant documents; and (5) the form of relief requested. Protests will be treated in accordance with Alaska Statutes (AS) 36.30.560-36.30.610.

STANDARD TERMS & CONDITIONS

CONDITIONS:

- 1. AUTHORITY: This ITB is written in accordance with AS 36.30 and 2 AAC 12.
- 2. COMPLIANCE: In the performance of a contract that results from this ITB, the contractor must comply with all applicable federal, state, and borough regulations, codes, and laws; be liable for all required insurance, licenses, permits and bonds; and pay all applicable federal, state, and borough taxes.
- 3. SUITABLE MATERIALS, ETC.: Unless otherwise specified, all materials, supplies or equipment offered by a bidder shall be new, unused, and of the latest edition, version, model or crop and of recent manufacture.
- 4. SPECIFICATIONS: Unless otherwise specified in the ITB, product brand names or model numbers specified in this ITB are examples of the type and quality of product required, and are not statements of preference. If the specifications describing an item conflict with a brand name or model number describing the item, the specifications govern. Reference to brand name or number does not preclude an offer of a comparable or better product, if full specifications and descriptive literature are provided for the product. Failure to provide such specifications and descriptive literature may be cause for rejection of the offer.
- 5. FIRM OFFER: For the purpose of award, offers made in accordance with this ITB must be good and firm for a period of ninety (90) days from the date of bid opening.
- 6. EXTENSION OF PRICES: In case of error in the extension of prices in the bid, the unit prices will govern; in a lot bid, the lot prices will govern.
- 7. BID PREPARATION COSTS: The State is not liable for any costs incurred by the bidder in bid preparation.
- 8. CONSOLIDATION OF AWARDS: Due to high administrative costs associated with processing of purchase orders, a single low bid of \$50 or less may, at the discretion of the State, be awarded to the next low bidder receiving other awards for consolidation purposes. This paragraph is not subject to the protest terms enumerated in "*INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS*", "FILING A PROTEST" above.
- 9. CONTRACT FUNDING: Bidders are advised that funds are available for the initial purchase and/or the first term of the contract. Payment and performance obligations for succeeding purchases and/or additional terms of the contract are subject to the availability and appropriation of funds.
- 10. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: An officer or employee of the State of Alaska may not seek to acquire, be a party to, or possess a financial interest in, this contract if (1) the officer or employee is an employee of the administrative unit that supervises the award of this contract; or (2) the officer or employee has the power to take or withhold official action so as to affect the award or execution of the contract.
- 11. ASSIGNMENT(S): Assignment of rights, duties, or payments under a contract resulting from this ITB is not permitted unless authorized in writing by the procurement officer of the contracting agency. Bids that are conditioned upon the State's approval of an assignment will be rejected as nonresponsive.
- 12. SUBCONTRACTOR(S): Within five (5) working days of notice from the state, the apparent low bidder must submit a list of the subcontractors that will be used in the performance of the contract. The list must include the name of each subcontractor and the location of the place of business for each subcontractor and evidence of each subcontractor's valid Alaska business license.
- 13. FORCE MAJEURE (Impossibility to perform): The parties to a contract resulting from this ITB are not liable for the consequences of any failure to perform, or default in performing, any of its obligations under the contract, if that failure or default is caused by any unforeseeable Force Majeure, beyond the control of, and without the fault or negligence of, the respective party. For the purposes of this ITB, Force Majeure will mean war (whether declared or not); revolution; invasion; insurrection; riot; civil commotion; sabotage; military or usurped power; lightning; explosion; fire; storm; drought; flood; earthquake; epidemic; quarantine; strikes; acts or restraints of governmental authorities affecting the project or directly or indirectly prohibiting or restricting the furnishing or use of materials or labor required; inability to secure materials, machinery, equipment or labor because of priority, allocation or other regulations of any governmental authorities.
- 14. LATE BIDS: Late bids are bids received after the time and date set for receipt of the bids. Late bids will not be accepted.
- 15. CONTRACT EXTENSION: Unless otherwise provided in this ITB, the State and the successful bidder/contractor agree: (1) that any holding over of the contract excluding any exercised renewal options, will be considered as a month-to-month extension, and all other terms and conditions shall remain in full force and effect and (2) to provide written notice to the other party of the intent to cancel such month-to-month extension at least thirty (30) days before the desired date of cancellation.
- 16. DEFAULT: In case of default by the contractor, for any reason whatsoever, the State of Alaska may procure the goods or services from another source and hold the contractor responsible for any resulting excess cost and may seek other remedies under law or equity.
- **17. DISPUTES**: If a contractor has a claim arising in connection with a contract resulting from this ITB that it cannot resolve with the State by mutual agreement, it shall pursue a claim, if at all, in accordance with the provisions of AS 36.30.620 632.
- 18. CONSUMER ELECTRICAL PRODUCT: AS 45.45.910 requires that "...a person may not sell, offer to sell, or otherwise transfer in the course of the person's business a consumer electrical product that is manufactured after August 14, 1990, unless the product is clearly marked as being listed by an approved third party certification program." Electrical consumer products manufactured before August 14, 1990, must either be clearly marked as being third party certified or be marked with a warning label that complies with AS 45.45.910(e). Even exempted electrical products must be marked with the warning label. By signature on this bid the bidder certifies that the product offered is in compliance with the law. STANDARD TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 19. SEVERABILITY: If any provision of the contract is declared by a court to be illegal or in conflict with any law, the validity of the remaining terms and provisions will not be affected; and, the rights and obligations of the parties will be construed and enforced as if the contract did not contain the particular provision held to be invalid.
- 20. GOVERNING LAW; FORUM SELECTION: A contract resulting from this ITB is governed by the laws of the State of Alaska. To the extent not otherwise governed by section 17 of these Standard Terms and Conditions, any claim concerning the contract shall be brought only in the Superior Court of the State of Alaska and not elsewhere.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

- 1. **ORDER DOCUMENTS**: Except as specifically allowed under this ITB, an ordering agency will not sign any vendor contract. The State is not bound by a vendor contract signed by a person who is not specifically authorized to sign for the State under this ITB. The State of Alaska Purchase Order, Contract Award and Delivery Order are the only order documents that may be used to place orders against the contract(s) resulting from this ITB.
- 2. BILLING INSTRUCTIONS: Invoices must be billed to the ordering agency's address shown on the individual Purchase Order, Contract Award or Delivery Order, not to the Division of General Services. The ordering agency will make payment after it receives the merchandise or service and the invoice. Questions concerning payment must be addressed to the ordering agency.
- 3. CONTINUING OBLIGATION OF CONTRACTOR: Notwithstanding the expiration date of a contract resulting from this ITB, the contractor is obligated to fulfill its responsibilities until warranty, guarantee, maintenance and parts availability requirements have completely expired.

PREFERENCES:

- 1. ALASKA BIDDER PREFERENCE: Award will be made to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder after an Alaska bidder preference of five percent (5%) has been applied. The preference will be given to a person who: (1) holds a current Alaska business license at the time designated in the invitation to bid for bid opening; (2) submits a bid for goods or services under the name on the Alaska business license; (3) has maintained a place of business within the state staffed by the bidder, or an employee of the bidder, for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the bid; (4) is incorporated or qualified to do business under the laws of the state, is a sole proprietorship and the proprietor is a resident of the state, is a limited liability company organized under AS 10.50 and all members are residents of the state, or is a partnership under AS 32.06 or AS 32.11 and all partners are residents of the state; and, (5) if a joint venture, is composed entirely of ventures that qualify under (1) (4) of this subsection. AS 36.30.170, AS 36.30.321(a) and AS 36.30.990(2)
- 2. ALASKA VETERAN PREFERENCE: If a bidder qualifies for the Alaska bidder preference under AS 36.30.321(a) and AS 36.30.990(2) and is a qualifying entity as defined in AS 36.30.321(f), they will be awarded an Alaska veteran preference of five percent (5%). The preference will be given to a (1) sole proprietorship owned by an Alaska veteran; (2) partnership under AS 32.06 or AS 32.11 if a majority of the partners are Alaska veterans; (3) limited liability company organized under AS 10.50 if a majority of the members are Alaska veterans; or (4) corporation that is wholly owned by individuals and a majority of the individuals are Alaska veterans, and may not exceed \$5,000. The bidder must also add value by actually performing, controlling, managing, and supervising the services provided, or for supplies, the bidder must have sold supplies of the general nature solicited to other state agencies, other governments, or the general public AS 36.30.321(i).
- 3. USE OF LOCAL FOREST PRODUCTS: In a project financed by state money in which the use of timber, lumber and manufactured lumber is required, only timber, lumber and manufactured lumber products originating in this state from Alaska forests shall be used unless the use of those products has been determined to be impractical, in accordance with AS 36.15.010 and AS 36.30.322.
- 4. LOCAL AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERIES PRODUCTS PREFERENCE: When agricultural, dairy, timber, lumber, or fisheries products are purchased using state money, a seven percent (7%) preference shall be applied to the price of the products harvested in Alaska, or in the case of fisheries products, the products harvested or processed within the jurisdiction of Alaska, in accordance with AS 36.15.050.
- ALASKA PRODUCT PREFERENCE: A bidder that designates the use of an Alaska Product which meets the requirements of the ITB specification and is designated as a Class I, Class II or Class III Alaska Product by the Department of Community & Economic Development shall receive a preference in the bid evaluation in accordance with AS 36.30.332 and 3 AAC 92.010.
- 6. EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM PREFERENCE: If a bidder qualifies for the Alaska bidder preference under AS 36.30.321(a) and AS 36.30.990(2), and is offering goods or services through an employment program as defined under 36.30.990(12), they will be awarded an Employment Program Preference of fifteen percent (15%) in accordance with AS 36.30.321(b).
- 7. ALASKANS WITH DISABILITIES PREFERENCE: If a bidder qualifies for the Alaska bidder preference under AS 36.30.321(a) and AS 36.30.990(2), and is a qualifying entity as defined in AS 36.30.321(d), they will be awarded an Alaskans with Disabilities Preference of ten percent (10%) in accordance with AS 36.30.321(d). A bidder may not receive both an Employment Program Preference and an Alaskans with Disabilities Preference.
- 8. PREFERENCE QUALIFICATION LETTER: Regarding preferences 6 and 7 above, the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation in the Department of Labor and Workforce Development maintains lists of Alaskan; [1] employment programs that qualify for preference, and [2] individuals who qualify for preference as Alaskan's with disabilities. In accordance with AS 36.30.321(i), in order to qualify for one of these preferences, a bidder must add value by actually performing, controlling, managing, and supervising the services provided, or for supplies, a bidder must have sold supplies of the general nature solicited to other state agencies, governments, or the general public.

As evidence of an individual's or a business' right to a certain preference, the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation will issue a certification letter. To take advantage of the preferences 6 or 7 above, an individual or business must be on the appropriate Division of Vocational Rehabilitation list at the time the bid is opened, and must attach a copy of their certification letter to their bid. The Bidder's failure to provide this certification letter with their bid will cause the State to disallow the preference.

ALASKA BUSINESS LICENSE AND OTHER REQUIRED LICENSES: Prior to the award of a contract, a bidder must hold a valid Alaska business license. However, in order to receive the Alaska Bidder Preference and other related preferences, such as the Alaska Veteran and Alaskans with Disabilities Preference, a bidder must hold a valid Alaska business license at the time designated for bid opening. For information in obtaining applicable licenses, offerors should contact the Department of Community and Economic Development, Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing:

Acceptable evidence that the bidder possesses a valid Alaska business license may consist of any one of the following:

- (a) copy of an Alaska business license;
- (b) certification on the bid that the bidder has a valid Alaska business license and has included the license number in the bid (see front page);
- (c) a canceled check for the Alaska business license fee;
- (d) a copy of the Alaska business license application with a receipt stamp from the state's occupational licensing office; or
- (e) a sworn and notarized affidavit that the bidder has applied and paid for the Alaska business license.

Note: Out-of-state business may obtain a business license online, through the Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing located here: https://www.commerce.alaska.gov/web/cbpl/ If any questions in regards to licensing occur, it is the sole responsibility of the bidder to make certain the proper license has been obtained.

You are not required to hold a valid Alaska business license at the time bids are opened if you possess one of the following licenses and are offering services or supplies under that specific line of business:

- fisheries business licenses issued by Alaska Department of Revenue or Alaska Department of Fish and Game,
- liquor licenses issued by Alaska Department of Revenue for alcohol sales only,
- insurance licenses issued by Alaska Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, Division of Insurance, or
- Mining licenses issued by Alaska Department of Revenue.

At the time designated for bid opening, all bidders must hold any other necessary applicable professional licenses required by Alaska Statute.

ALASKA BIDDER PREFERENCE: An Alaska Bidder Preference of five percent will be applied prior to evaluation. The preference will be given to a Bidder who:

(1) holds a current Alaska business license at the time designated for bid opening;

- (2) submits a proposal for goods or services under the name appearing on the Bidder's current Alaska business license;
- (3) has maintained a place of business within the State staffed by the Bidder, or an employee of the bidder, for a period of six months immediately preceding the date of the bid;
- (4) is incorporated or qualified to do business under the laws of the State, is a sole proprietorship and the proprietor is a resident of the State, is a limited liability company (LLC) organized under AS 10.50 and all members are residents of the State, or is a partnership under AS 32.06 or AS 32.11 and all partners are residents of the State; and
- (5) if a joint venture, is composed entirely of ventures that qualify under (1)-(4) of this subsection.

ALASKA BIDDER PREFERENCE STATEMENT: In order to receive the Alaska Bidder Preference, the bid must also include a statement certifying that the Bidder is eligible to receive the Alaska Bidder Preference.

If the Bidder is a LLC or partnership as identified in (4) of this subsection, the statement must also identify each member or partner and include a statement certifying that all members or partners are residents of the State.

If the Bidder is a joint venture which includes a LLC or partnership as identified in (4) of this subsection, the statement must also identify each member or partner of each LLC or partnership that is included in the joint venture and include a statement certifying that all of those members or partners are residents of the State.

PREFERENCE QUALIFICATION: In order to qualify for an Alaska Veterans Preference, Employment Program Preference, or Alaskans with Disabilities Preference, a Bidder must add value by actually performing, controlling, managing, and supervising the services provided, or a bidder must have sold supplies of the general nature solicited to other state agencies, governments, or the general public.

ALASKA PRODUCT PREFERENCE: Bidders who offer products which have received certification by the Department of Commerce and Economic Development and that are listed in the current published edition of the "Alaska Products Preference List" will receive this preference. In order to qualify for the Alaska Product Preference, a bidder must provide the qualified product on a 100% basis.

There are no provisions under Alaska Statutes or regulations that allow for product exchanges, substitutions, or permit the product to be co-mingled with other products. Rather, AS 36.30.330 provides for a penalty for failing to use the designated Alaska products.

Products are classified in one of three categories:

- Class I products receive a **3% preference**.
- Class II products receive a **5% preference**.
- Class III products receive a **7% preference**.

Bidders must check the correct preference box beneath each line item. When the bids are evaluated, the preference percentage will be deducted from the bid price. If a Bidder fails to check one of the product

preference boxes, no preference will be given. If a Bidder checks the incorrect product preference box, no preference will be given.

BIDDERS WITH DISABILITIES: The State of Alaska complies with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. COMPLIANCE WITH ADA: By signature of their bid the Bidder certifies that they comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and the regulations issued thereunder by the federal government.

Services or activities furnished to the general public on behalf of the State must be fully accessible. This is intended to ensure that agencies are in accordance with 28 CFR Part 35 Section 35.130 and that services, programs or activities furnished to the public through a contract do not subject qualified individuals with a disability to discrimination based on the disability.

CONTRACT PERFORMANCE LOCATION: By signature on their bid, the Bidder certifies that all services provided under this contract by the Contractor and all subcontractors will be performed in the United States.

If the Bidder cannot certify that all work will be performed in the United States, the Bidder must contact the Procurement Officer in writing to request a waiver at least 10 days prior to the deadline for receipt of bids.

The request must include a detailed description of the portion of work that will be performed outside the United States, where, by whom, and the reason the waiver is necessary.

Failure to comply with these requirements may cause the State to reject the bid as non-responsive, or cancel the contract.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING: By signature on their bid, the bidder certifies that the bidder is not established and headquartered or incorporated and headquartered in a country recognized as Tier 3 in the most recent United States Department of State's Trafficking in Persons Report.

Failure to comply with this requirement will cause the state to reject the bid as non-responsive, or cancel the contract.

CONTRACT INTENT: This Invitation to Bid (ITB) is intended to result in a mandatory use contract for the purchase and delivery of traffic sign material of various sizes, types, and colors, on an as-needed basis, for multiple locations throughout Alaska for DOT&PF.

For all other Alaskan locations NOT identified in the solicitation / Bid Schedule, the State, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to:

 Determine the nearest location under the resulting contract and purchase at the contract's pricing for that location (Lot). Any additional charges from the Lot to the final destination (e.g. shipping) will be at the State's expense.

CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION: The administration of this contract is the responsibility of the Procurement Officer of Record appointed by the Department of Transportation & Public Facilities, Statewide Procurement.

CONTRACT PERIOD: The length of the contract will be from the date of award through June 30, 2020, with the option to renew for four (4) additional (1) year renewal options, under the same terms and conditions as the original contract. Renewals are to be exercised solely by the State. The State will issue Unilateral Renewal Options for each exercised optional renewal.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO AWARD: After the responses to this ITB have been opened and evaluated, a tabulation of the bids will be prepared. This tabulation, called a Notice of Intent to Award, serves two purposes. It lists the name of each company or person that offered a bid and the price they bid. It also provides notice of the state's intent to award a contract(s) to the Bidder(s) indicated.

The Procurement Officer will provide a copy of the Notice of Intent to each company or person who responded to the ITB. Bidders identified as the apparent low responsive Bidders are instructed not to proceed until a Purchase Order, Contract Award, Lease, or some other form of written notice is given by the Procurement Officer.

A company or person who proceeds prior to receiving a Purchase Order, Contract Award, Lease, or some other form of written notice from the contracting officer, does so without a contract, and at their own risk.

PAYMENT FOR STATE PURCHASES: Payment for agreements under \$500,000 for the undisputed purchase of goods or services provided to a State agency, will be made within 30 days of the receipt of a proper billing or the delivery of the goods or services to the location(s) specified in the agreement, whichever is later.

A late payment is subject to 1.5% interest per month on the unpaid balance. Interest will not be paid if there is a dispute or if there is an agreement that establishes a lower interest rate or precludes the charging of interest.

INVOICES: Invoices must be sent directly to the ordering agency's address shown on the individual Purchase Order, Contract Award or Delivery Order. The ordering agency will only make payment after it receives the merchandise or service and the invoice. Questions concerning payment must be addressed to the ordering agency.

INDEMNIFICATION: The contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Contracting agency from and against any claim of, or liability for error, omission or negligent act of the Contractor under this agreement. The Contractor will not be required to indemnify the Contracting agency for a claim of, or liability for, the independent negligence of the Contracting agency.

If there is a claim of, or liability for, the joint negligent error or omission of the Contractor and the independent negligence of the Contracting agency, the indemnification and hold harmless obligation shall be apportioned on a comparative fault basis. "Contractor" and "Contracting agency", as used within this and the following article, include the employees, agents and other contractors who are directly responsible, respectively, to each.

The term "independent negligence" is negligence other than in the Contracting agency's selection, administration, monitoring, or controlling of the Contractor and in approving or accepting the Contractor's work.

INSURANCE: Without limiting Contractor's indemnification, it is agreed that Contractor will purchase, at its own expense and maintain in force at all times during the performance of services under this agreement, the following policies of insurance. Where specific limits are shown, it is understood that they will be the minimum acceptable limits. **If the Contractor's policy contains higher limits**, the State will be entitled to coverage to the extent of such higher limits. Certificates of Insurance must be furnished to the Procurement Officer prior to beginning work and must provide for a notice of cancellation, non-renewal, or material change of conditions in accordance with policy provisions.

Failure to furnish satisfactory evidence of insurance or lapse of the policy is a material breach of this contract and will be grounds for termination of the Contractor's services. All insurance policies must comply with, and be issued by insurers licensed to transact the business of insurance under AS 21.

Proof of insurance is required for the following:

<u>Workers' Compensation Insurance</u>: The Contractor must provide and maintain, for all employees engaged in work under this contract, coverage as required by AS 23.30.045, and; where applicable, any other statutory obligations including but not limited to Federal U.S.L. & H. and Jones Act requirements. The policy must waive subrogation against the State.

<u>Commercial General Liability Insurance</u>: Covering all business premises and operations used by the Contractor in the performance of services under this agreement with minimum coverage limits of \$300,000 combined single limit per occurrence.

<u>Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance</u>: Covering all vehicles used by the Contractor in the performance of services under this agreement with minimum coverage limits of \$300,000 combined single limit per occurrence.

Failure to supply satisfactory proof of insurance within the time required will cause the State to declare the Bidder non-responsible and to reject the bid.

FIRM, UNQUALIFIED AND UNCONDITIONAL OFFER: Bidders must provide enough information with their bid to constitute a definite, firm, unqualified and unconditional offer. To be responsive, a bid must constitute a definite, firm, unqualified and unconditional offer to meet all of the material terms of the ITB. Material terms are those that could affect the **price, quantity, quality, or delivery**. Also included as material terms, are those which are clearly identified in the ITB and which, for reasons of policy, must be complied with at risk of bid rejection for non-responsiveness.

THIRD-PARTY FINANCING AGREEMENTS NOT ALLOWED: Because of the additional administrative and accounting time required of State agencies when third party financing agreements are permitted, they will not be allowed under this contract.

PRICES ADJUSTMENTS: Contract prices will remain firm from the date of award through June 30, 2020. Annually, beginning July 1, 2020, the Contractor may request a price adjustment. Requests must be in writing and received thirty (30) days prior to the date the adjustment will take effect.

Price adjustments will be made in accordance with the percentage changes in the U. S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Producer Price Index (PPI) Commodity Series ID #WPU10250105; Aluminum Sheet and Strip.

The State will use the PPI value ending January 2020 as the Base Index. The percentage difference between the base index of January 2020 and the PPI issued for the requested adjustment period will determine the maximum allowable adjustment of the original contract prices.

No retroactive price adjustments will be allowed.

PRICE DECREASES: During the period of the contract, all price decreases experienced by the Contractor must be passed on to the State. Failure to strictly and faithfully adhere to this clause, within the time required, will be considered in breach of contract and the contract will be terminated.

ALTERATIONS OR SUBSTITUTIONS: The contractor must obtain the written approval from the contracting officer prior to making any alterations to the specifications contained in this ITB or substitutions of product throughout the contract period. The State will not pay for alterations or substitutions that are not approved in advance and in writing by the contracting officer.

DISCONTINUED ITEMS: In the event an item is discontinued by the manufacturer during the life of the contract, another item may be substituted, provided that the contracting officer makes a written determination that it is equal to or better than the discontinued item and provided that it is sold at the same price or less than the discontinued item.

ACCEPTANCE: If at any time the delivered product fails to meet specifications, the State will at its option, cancel the contract, or allow the contractor to replace the defective product. In no instance will the State be responsible for cost associated to remedy defective product.

ORDER PLACEMENT: During the term(s) of the contract(s), the State will place orders through State issued Purchase or Delivery Orders.

ESTIMATED QUANTITIES: The estimated quantities referenced in the Bid Schedule are the State's estimated annual requirements and may vary more or less from the quantities actually purchased. The estimates in the Bid Schedule are for evaluation purposes and do not guarantee any minimum or maximum purchase under the resulting contract. Orders will be issued throughout the life of the contract for various locations on an as-needed basis.

VOLUME REPORTS: Twice annually, the Contractor must furnish a volume report of the contract usage in the previous July through December and January through June six month periods. The report for July through December is due no later than January 30th and the report for January through June is due no later than July 31st.

F.O.B. POINT: The F.O.B. points for this ITB will be the locations specified in the "Bid Schedule." The Contractor will be required to prepare the items for shipping and to ship them to the destination specified in the State's order. Ownership of and title to the ordered items will remain with the Contractor until all items have been delivered to their final destination and are accepted by the State.

PRICING: All Contractor costs must be included in the Contractor's bid price, including but not limited to: packaging, shipping, and delivery. No additional charges for packaging, shipping, or delivery will be allowed.

DELIVERY: Delivery requirements are indicated on the "Bid Schedule" for each Lot. A Bidder's failure to make an entry in the space provided will be construed as an offer to deliver within the number of days required. Bids which specify deliveries in excess of that required, may be considered nonresponsive and the bids may be rejected.

PACKAGING: All packaging must be new and suitable for highway, oceanic, and short-term warehouse storage.

SHIPPING DAMAGE: Goods damaged in shipment are the responsibility of the Contractor, and the State will not accept or pay for damaged goods. The Contractor is also responsible for filing all claims against the carrier(s) for damages incurred to goods in transit from the point of origin to the final destination.

The State's inspection of goods upon delivery is for the sole purpose of identification and not as confirmation the goods are undamaged. The ordering agency will provide the Contractor with notification of damaged goods when identified.

At the discretion of the ordering agency, the State can deduct the cost of the damaged goods from the invoice prior to payment or, if the original invoice is paid in full, receive a credit, reimbursement, or replacement of the damaged goods at no additional cost.

WORKMANSHIP & MATERIALS: All work must be performed in a thorough and workmanlike manner and in accordance with current industry practices. The Contractor will be held responsible for the quality of the service, maintenance and inspections. Service, maintenance and inspections that are improperly done will be done over, by the Contractor, at the Contractor's risk and expense.

CONTINUING OBLIGATION OF CONTRACTOR: The Contractor agrees that none of its responsibilities under this contract are transferable and that the Contractor alone shall continue to be solely responsible until the expiration date of the contract. Such responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the provision of equipment, training, warranty service, maintenance, parts and the provision of consumable supplies. By signature on the face page of this ITB, the Bidder acknowledges this requirement and indicates unconditional acceptance of this continuing obligation clause.

METHOD OF AWARD: Award will be made to the lowest responsive and responsible Bidder. There are seven (7) lots. In order to be considered responsive, Bidders must bid on all items within all lots.

Alaska Traffic Manual (ATM) – The ATM is the standard for traffic control devices used on public roads in Alaska. DESCRIPTION OF WORK:

This Contractor must supply the following Fixed Legend and Variable Legend Highway signs. All signs will be fabricated in conformance with the most recent version of the ATM, ASDS and Standard Drawings S-00.10, S-01.00, and Attachment A.

SPECIFICATIONS (cont.)

1. <u>FIXED LEGEND SIGNS:</u>

This includes sign types and object markers in the ATM and ASDS. Signs must have mounting holes and wind braces or framing if required.

a) Orange background signs

2. VARIABLE LEGEND SIGNS:

This includes modifications of signs listed in the ATM and ASDS. The layout of variable legend signs must conform to the ATM and ASDS and be designed by the Contractor and approved by the State prior to fabrication. Signs must also have mounting holes and wind braces or framing if required.

4. <u>SHOP DRAWINGS:</u>

Submit an electronic PFD shop drawing for all Variable Legend signs for approval prior to fabrication. Each sign must show the following:

- Overall dimensions
- Dimensions of horizontal and vertical characters and spaces
- Legend and letter series
- Panel thickness and sheeting material type
- Whether the sign will be framed
- Proposed location of splices if applicable
- List the Maintenance Station for Delivery of the Sign Order.

5. <u>**REFLECTIVE SHEETING:**</u>

Use Type IV **retroreflective** sheeting (for lettering, symbols, borders, and background) on sheet aluminum panels for all signs EXCEPT FOR:

- a) Orange Background Signs: Use either Type VIII or Type IX fluorescent orange **retroreflective** sheeting.
- b) Railroad Crossbucks and Vertical Crossbuck Supports: Use white Type VIII or Type IX **retroreflective** sheeting for background of sign.
- c) Non-illuminated Overhead Signs with White Legends on Green Backgrounds: Use Type IX **retroreflective** sheeting for legends and background, creating the legend in one of the following ways:
 - Cut border and legend from white Type IX **retroreflective** sheeting and adhere to a green Type IX background, or
 - Cut stencil of border and legend out of green transparent acrylic film and use transparent adhesive to overlay the film on a white Type IX reflective background.
- d) Fluorescent Yellow-Green School Area Signs: Use Type VIII or Type IX **retroreflective** sheeting for background.
- e) Fluorescent Yellow Pedestrian or Bicyclist Warning Signs: Use Type VIII or Type IX **retroreflective** sheeting for background.

6. <u>REFLECTIVE SHEETING WARRANTY:</u>

Supply manufacturer's warranty for reflective sheeting, including retention of fluorescent yellowgreen (measured in accordance with ASTM E 2301) for ten years according to the following criteria:

- Minimum Fluorescent Luminance Factor Y_F: 20%
- Minimum Total Luminance Factor YT: 35% W

SPECIFICATIONS (cont.)

The warranty must stipulate that: If the sheeting fails to meet minimum fluorescent values within the first seven (7) years from the date of fabrication, the manufacturer will, at the manufacturer's expense, restore the sign surface to its original effectiveness.

If the **retroreflective** sheeting fails to meet the minimum fluorescent values within the 8th through the 10th year from date of fabrication, the manufacturer will, at the manufacturer's expense, provide enough new replacement sign sheeting to the Department to restore the sign surface to its original effectiveness.

Use a manufacturer-recommended clear coat on all screened signs.

Frame signs as required in the Specifications.

Retroreflective sheeting shall meet AASHTO M 268, for the type specified.

Signs shall be constructed of single sheets of **retroreflective** sheeting. Splices or overlaps in reflective sheeting are not acceptable and will be refused.

ACRYLIC PRISMATIC REFLECTORS

Shall meet AASHTO M 290 and the dimensions and colors shown in the ATM or MUTCD.

MOUNTING HOLES

Signs shall be drilled for mounting in conformance with the Specifications.

7. WIND BRACING: LOTS 1 THROUGH 5:

Signs must be constructed with bracing when required per Standard Drawing S-01.00 (Std. Dwg. S-01.00). The Contractor must also supply the steel brace, nuts, bolts and washers for attaching the brace to the sign only. The Contractor is not required to supply the hardware necessary to attach the sign to the post. The State may require bracing on signs smaller than thirty (30) inches as designated on the order.

Street signs (D3-1, D3-1A, D3-1D) 48 inches or longer will be constructed of two single sided panels mounted according to Std. Dwg. S-01.00 "Small Street Name Sign Bracing Detail". The Contractor must supply aluminum tubes and rivets as specified on Std. Dwg. S-01.00.

Signs must be constructed with framing when required by Std. Dwg. S-01.00. The Contractor shall supply and install frames and rivets as specified on Std. Dwg. S-01.00.

SPECIFICATIONS (cont.)

8. WIND BRACING: LOTS 6 THROUGH 7:

Signs must be constructed with wind braces when required per Attachment A. The Contractor must also supply all brackets, clips, bands, nuts, bolts, rivets and washers as needed for attaching the frame to the sign. The Contractor is not required to supply the hardware necessary to attach the sign to the post. The State requires framing on all D3-1 street name signs (D3-1, D3-1A, D3-1D).

Street name signs (D3-1, D3-1A, D3-1D) will be forty-two (42) inches or less in width. Street name signs must be constructed of two single sided panels mounted according to Attachment A. The Contractor must supply and install aluminum tubes and rivets as specified in Attachment A.

9. FRAMING:

All framing materials must be attached to signs per the Standard Drawing S-00.10 or Attachment A, depending on region.

10. <u>LABEL:</u>

Each sign (except D3-1 double faced signs) shall have a label attached to the back of the sign in the lower right corner. Make the label at least 15 square inches and show the year the sign was purchased from the manufacturer.

Show the last two digits of the year in clear and bold numbers. Make the label from Type I or brighter reflective sheeting. Use background and legend colors shown in the following Table.

11. WORKMANSHIP:

All materials and finished signs are subject to inspection.

Signs with defects that impair serviceability, appearance, quick legibility, create a difference in appearance between day and night, or detract from general appearance or color match will be rejected. The State is the sole arbiter of sign acceptability.

Finished signs must be clean and have no chatter marks, burrs, sharp edges, loose rivets, bubbles, delaminated reflective sheeting, or aluminum marks. Do not make repairs to the face sheet.
