(2) the license would violate any restriction in 3 AAC 306.010 or 3 AAC

306.015;

(3) the license would violate any restriction applicable to the particular license type authorized under this chapter;

(4) the license is prohibited under this chapter as a result of an ordinance or election conducted under AS 17.38.210, 3 AAC 306.200, or 3 AAC 306.230;

(5) [THE BOARD FINDS THAT] the <u>applicant's actions or the</u> operating plan does not adequately demonstrate that the applicant will comply with applicable provisions of this chapter; [OR]

(6) the license would not be in the best interests of the public; or

(b) After review of the application and all relevant information, the board will deny an application for renewal of a marijuana establishment license if the board finds

(1) any cause listed in (a) of this section;

(2) <u>repealed $\frac{6}{2}$ /21 /2019</u> [THAT THE LICENSE HAS BEEN REVOKED FOR ANY CAUSE];

(3) that the license has been operated in violation of a condition or restriction the u.c.
 board previously imposed; [or]

(4) that the applicant is delinquent in the payment of taxes due in whole or in part from operation of the licensed business;

(5) that a protest by the local governing body is not arbitrary, capricious, and

unreasonable; or

(6) that the licensee has lost right to possession of its licensed premises.

(c) After review of the application and all relevant information, the board will deny an application for transfer of license to another person if the board finds

(1) any cause listed in (a) of this section;

(2) that the transferor has not paid all debts or taxes arising from the operation of

the business licensed under this chapter unless the transferor gives security for the payment of the debts or taxes satisfactory to the creditor or taxing authority;

(3) that transfer of the license to another person would result in violation of the

provisions of this chapter relating to identity of licensees and financing of licensees; [OR]

(4) that the prospective transferee does not have the qualifications of an original

applicant required under this chapter; or

(5) that a protest by the local governing body is not arbitrary, capricious, and unreasonable.

(d) If the board denies an application for a new license, renewal of a license, license conversion, or transfer of a license to another person, the board will, not later than 15 days after

the board meeting at which the application was denied, furnish a written statement of issues to the applicant, explaining the reason for the denial in clear and concise language, and identifying any statute or regulation on which the denial is based. In the notice of denial the board will inform the applicant of the right to an informal conference under 3 AAC 306.085 and to a formal hearing under 3 AAC 306.090.

(e) After review of the application and all relevant information, the board will deny an application for license conversion if the board finds <u>that</u>

(1) the application contains any false statement of material fact;

(2) the license would violate any restriction applicable to the particular license type authorized under this chapter;

(3) the license is prohibited under this chapter as a result of an ordinance or election conducted under AS 17.38.210, 3AAC 306.200, or 3 AAC 306.230;

(4) [THE BOARD FINDS THAT] the <u>applicant's actions or the</u> application does not adequately demonstrate that the applicant will comply with applicable provisions of this chapter;

The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Marijuana Control Board against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Marijuana Control Board at its May 1, 2019, meeting, after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations concern the criteria for marijuana license denial, including local government protest and applicant actions. The amendments would add the "applicant's actions" as a reason to deny a license. This appears vague, but applicants retain their due process rights and any decision using this language to deny an application will be subject to the same review as any other board decision. The board feels that it is necessary to deny a license in the event that an applicant creates a danger to the public without violating an existing law.

The March 3, 2019, public notice and the May 22, 2019, adoption order both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.
