



**Notice of proposed changes relating to fees and continuing education
requirements in the regulations of the State Board of Registration for
Architects, Engineers, and Land Surveyors**

Proposed Regulations - FAQ

July 2019

1. What is the purpose of the proposed regulations? What will this regulation do?

12 AAC 02.110. The purpose of the proposed regulations is to add late renewal penalty fee, add an extension option and associated fee to comply with continuing education requirements, and clean up outdated references to fees associated with the examination fees for landscape architects.

12 AAC 36.170. Fees. The purpose of the proposed regulations is to add late renewal penalty fee and add an extension option and associated fee to comply with continuing education requirements, and clean up outdated references to fees associated with the examination fees for landscape architects. Allow the board to maintain current renewal fees, while also addressing late renewals and issues with continuing education compliance. Provide an additional option for licensees to comply with continuing education requirements and accommodate time extensions.

12 AAC 36.510. Continuing education requirements. The purpose of the proposed regulations is to provide an additional option for licensees to comply with continuing education requirements and accommodate time extensions.

2. What are the costs to comply with the proposed regulations?

\$50 late renewal penalty fee and \$50 continuing education extension period fee.

3. When will the regulations be effective?

After public comment deadline, comments received are compiled and given to the Board for consideration. The Board may adopt the regulation as written/publicly noticed, may amend and

adopt them, choose to take no action, or may withdraw the proposed regulations in part or in its whole. After Board action, the adopted regulations goes to Department of Law (DOL) for final review/approval. DOL either approves or disapproves regulations. Once approved by DOL, it goes to the Lt. Governor for filing. Regulation takes effect on the 30th day after they have been filed by the Lt. Governor.
