The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Board of Certified Direct-Entry Midwives after the close of the public comment period. The regulations concern the course of study requirements for certification as a direct-entry midwife by eliminating detailed subject matter descriptions and condensing approved courses to courses approved by the midwifery Education Accreditation Council or the U.S. Department of Education.

The August 9, 2018, public notice and the July 16, 2019, certification of adoption both state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.

We have made some technical corrections to conform the regulations in accordance with AS 44.62.125. The corrections are shown on the attached copy of the regulations.


