<u>NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES ON DEATH OF A LICENSEE</u> <u>IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD</u>

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board proposes to adopt regulation changes in 3 AAC 304 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with death of a licensee, including the following:

3 AAC 304.215 is proposed to be repealed and readopted. The intended effect of this repeal is to:

- Subsection (a) is essentially what is currently in the regulation, but clarifies that this applies to licensees who are sole proprietors or sole owners of entities.
- Subsection (b) proposes that upon the death of a licensee who owns 50% or more of an entity holding a license, the surviving licensees may continue to operate the license but a transfer application or request for extension must be filed within 90 days of the individual's death. If the transfer or extension request is not submitted, the business must cease operating until a transfer is filed. Only one extension is allowed, unless there is a delay in appointing a personal representative for the estate of the deceased licensee which is cause for allowing additional extensions.
- Subsection (c) proposes that upon the death of a licensee who owns less than 50% of an entity holding a license, the surviving licensees may continue to operate the license but must submit a transfer application or report a change of ownership within 90 days of the individual's death. (Should the surviving licensees not comply with that requirement, an NOV can be issued and if appropriate, an accusation can be served.)

You may comment on the proposed regulation changes, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed changes, by submitting written comments to Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office at 550 West 7th Avenue, Suite 1600, Anchorage AK 99501. Additionally, the_Alcoholic Beverage Control Board will accept comments by email at amco.regs@alaska.gov. Comments may also be submitted through the Alaska Online Public Notice System by accessing this notice on the system and using the comment link. The comments must be received not later than 4:30pm on October 30, 2019.

You may submit written questions relevant to the proposed action to the Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office at 550 West 7th Avenue, Suite 1600, Anchorage, AK 99501 or to <u>amco.regs@alaska.gov</u>. The questions must be received at least 10 days before the end of the public comment period. The Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office will aggregate its response to substantially similar questions and make the questions and responses available on the Alaska Online Public Notice System and AMCO website.

After the public comment period ends, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board will either adopt the proposed regulation changes or other provisions dealing with the same subject, without further notice, or decide to take no action. The language of the final regulation may be different from that of the proposed regulation. You should comment during the time allowed if your interests could be affected. Written comments received are public records and are subject to public inspection.

Fiscal information: The proposed regulation changes are not expected to require an increased appropriation.
